Current situation

New Zealand has 451 confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. For a summary of the current status see our <u>latest media release (28</u> <u>March</u>). New Zealand is currently at Alert Level 4 – Eliminate

These alert levels specify the public health and social measures to be taken. Nationwide, New Zealand is currently at Level 4 – Eliminate. This means that it is likely that the disease is not contained. See more information about <u>Alert levels</u>.
