

Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Situation Report

Palau Ministry of Health - External Situation Report 05 August 2020 - 09:00 PWT

GLOBAL SITUATION OVERVIEW

The Ministry of Health (MOH) is closely monitoring an ongoing pandemic of a coronavirus disease which is affecting over 180 countries globally. The World Health Organization (WHO) declared the outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) on January 30, 2020, designated its official name as Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) on February 11, 2020, and characterized it as a *pandemic* on March 12, 2020.

As of August 05, 2020:

- At least 18,458,646* confirmed cases of COVID-19 globally, including 375*** in Guam, 46 in the Northern Mariana Is. (CNMI), 2,591 cases in Hawaii, 62 in French Polynesia, 22 in New Caledonia, 27 in Fiji, and 114 in Papua New Guinea.
- 332,754** confirmed cases within the Western Pacific Region.
- 698,232* deaths reported globally 8,513** deaths in the Western Pacific Region, 5*** deaths on Guam, 27 in Hawaii, 2 in CNMI, 1 in Fiji, 2 in Papua New Guinea.
- 11,048,642* people have recovered from COVID-19 globally.

PALAU READINESS AND RESPONSE

As of August 05, 2020:

- There are NO SUSPECTED or CONFIRMED CASES of COVID-19 in Palau.
- MOH Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activated on Jan. 22, 2020 to implement preparedness and response measures to minimize the risk of importation and potential local transmission of COVID-19 to Palau.
- BNH ventilators: 30 total capacity, 5 portable vent, 2 pediatric vent, 18 adult vents (0 in use), 5 in calibration.
- <u>COVID-19 Isolation & Quarantine:</u> **207** in quarantine facility, **0** in self-quarantine, **0** in BNH isolation, **0** in alternative care and isolation site.
- <u>COVID-19 Testing (since Apr. 14)</u>: 1,228 tests conducted, 0 total positive, 1,228 total negative, 0 pending results.
- COVID-19 testing ongoing based on priority groups including persons meeting COVID-19 case definition, symptomatic patients, first responders and front-line workers, and quarantined inbound travelers.
- Alternative Care Site (ACS) is currently being prepared to receive and care for positive cases.
- MOH 24-hour COVID-19 Hotline activated for public inquiries: +680-488-0555.
- Health screening continues at Palau International Airport for chartered and private aircrafts; health screening at Malakal seaport continues for incoming vessels. Screening data:
- o Past 24 hours: **0** flight screened, **0** travelers; **0** vessel screened, **0** travelers; **0** secondary screening.
- o Since Jan. 23: 175 flights screened, 15,351 travelers; 61 vessels screened, 1,934 travelers; 550 secondary screening.
- All commercial air travel to Palau is temporary suspended as of Mar. 26 until further notice as airlines temporarily halt services. Air mail and cargo service continues on a weekly basis through chartered services.
- Executive Order No. 442 signed on July 31, 2020 re-establishing essential air services to and from Palau, beginning no later than September 1, 2020.
- MOH issued a Certification of an Unavoidable Public Health Emergency for COVID-19 on Mar. 17, 2020.
- MOH issued Directive No. 170-20 on July 7, 2020 re-authorizing isolation and quarantine measures for COVID-19.
- The public is urged not to panic and to continue practicing public health measures to prevent respiratory infections:
 - Hand Hygiene: Frequent handwashing with soap and water or hand rub with 70% alcohol-based sanitizer.
 - Respiratory Etiquettes: Cover cough and sneeze with clean tissue or shirt sleeve.
 - Avoid close contact with sick people and stay away from others if you are sick. Call your doctor or hospital for advise.
 - Clean/disinfect frequently touched surfaces/objects.
