



Epidemiological curve of confirmed COVID-19 cases by notification date, NSW, 2020







Figure 2. Epidemiological curve of confirmed COVID-19 cases by likely source of infection and notification date in NSW, reported up to 8pm 24 March 2020 Note: The details on source of infection are subject to change as public health investigations and case interviews are ongoing.

Total number of COVID-19 tests by LHD , NSW, 2020








Confirmed cases of COVID-19 across New South Wales as of 24 March 2020 at 8 pm, by Local Health District (LHD)







Airport screening



Since 2 February 2020, NSW Health been assisting the Australian Government in assessing passengers who arrive at Sydney International Airport from countries with high levels

of COVID-19 community transmission. On 25 March 2020, a total of 1,870 passenger arrivals were screened for possible symptoms of COVID-19. 19 people were transferred to hospital for further evaluation and COVID-19 testing where clinically indicated.
