



Figure: Epidemiological curve of


contirmed COVID-19 cases by likely source of infection and notification date in NSW, reported up to 8pm 29 March 2020



Confirmed cases of COVID-19 across Sydney Metropolitan region as of 29 March 2020 at 8pm, by local health district (LHD)









### Confirmed cases of COVID 19 in Sydney Metropolitan region as of 8pm 29 March 2020 by Local Government Area







### Airport screening



Since 2 February 2020, NSW Health been assisting the Australian Government in assessing passengers who arrive at Sydney International Airport from countries with high levels

of COVID-19 community transmission. On 29 March 2020, a total of 1,364 passenger arrivals were screened for possible symptoms of COVID-19. 32 people were transferred to hospital for further evaluation and COVID-19 testing where clinically indicated.

To date, 42,649 passenger arrivals have been screened for possible symptoms of COVID-19. A total of 386 people have been transferred to hospital for further evaluation and COVID-19 testing where clinically indicated.
