# Latest case counts on novel coronavirus

March 11, 2020

A new coronavirus is causing a respiratory infection known as COVID-19. BC has 46 confirmed cases, however, the risk of the virus spreading remains low.

### British Columbia

- 46 confirmed cases including:
  - Four individuals who have recovered, as indicated by the resolution of symptoms, followed by two successive negative test results 24 hours apart.
  - One individual who has died.
- 2,008 individuals and 2,803 samples tested as of March 6, 2020.

*The number of samples tested will be higher than the number of individuals tested because some individuals are tested more than once.*
