#### **Current Situation**

NEW Last updated: November 23, 2020

Public health officials advise seven additional deaths due to COVID-19 have been reported today, including:

- a female in her 90s from Winnipeg, linked to the Maples Long-Term Care Home outbreak;
- a female in her 70s from Winnipeg, linked to the Holy Family Personal Care Home outbreak;
- a male in his 80s from the Southern Health-Santé Sud health region, linked to the Menno Home outbreak;
- a female in her 80s from Winnipeg;
- a male in his 60s from Winnipeg;
- a female in her 80s from Winnipeg; and
- a male in his 70s from the Southern Health-Santé Sud health region.

The current five-day COVID-19 test positivity rate is 14 per cent provincially and 13.8 per cent in Winnipeg, and 543 new cases of the virus have been identified as of 9:30 a.m. This brings the total number of lab-confirmed cases in Manitoba to 14,087.

Today's data shows:

- 21 cases in the Interlake-Eastern health region;
- 27 cases in the Northern health region;
- 12 cases in the Prairie Mountain Health region;
- 118 cases in the Southern Health-Santé Sud health region; and
- 368 cases in the Winnipeg health region.

The data also shows:

- 8,498 active cases and 5,353 individuals who have recovered from COVID-19;
- there are 296 people in hospital with 52 people in intensive care; and
- the number of deaths due to COVID-19 is 236.

Laboratory testing numbers show 2,798 tests were completed yesterday, bringing the total number of lab tests completed since early February to 333,694. Case investigations continue and if a public health risk is identified, the public will be notified.
