



# Cases and Risk of COVID-19 in Saskatchewan

## Summary

As of April 2, there are thirteen (13) new confirmed cases, bringing the total to 206 reported cases of COVID-19 in Saskatchewan.

- 206 cases are confirmed and no (0) cases are presumptive
- Six (6) of the cases are individuals in the zero to 19-year-old category; all others are adults, with 55% of the cases are males and 45% are females
- Ten (10) cases are a result of local exposures that are unidentifiable and are not related to travel or mass gathering/event-related
- A total of four (4) individuals are hospitalized; including two (2) inpatient hospitalizations and two (2) in ICU hospitalizations
- Three (3) Saskatchewan residents with COVID-19 have died. Saskatchewan now has a fatality rate of 1.5%
- A total of thirty-six (36) individuals have recovered (17.5%)
- To date, 11,395 COVID-19 tests have been performed in Saskatchewan

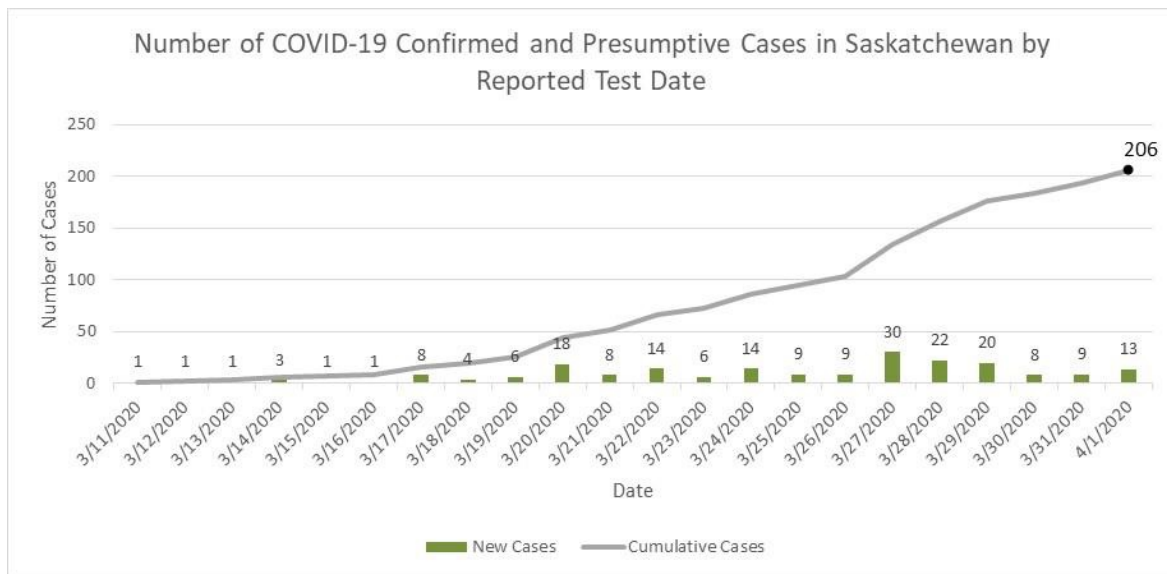

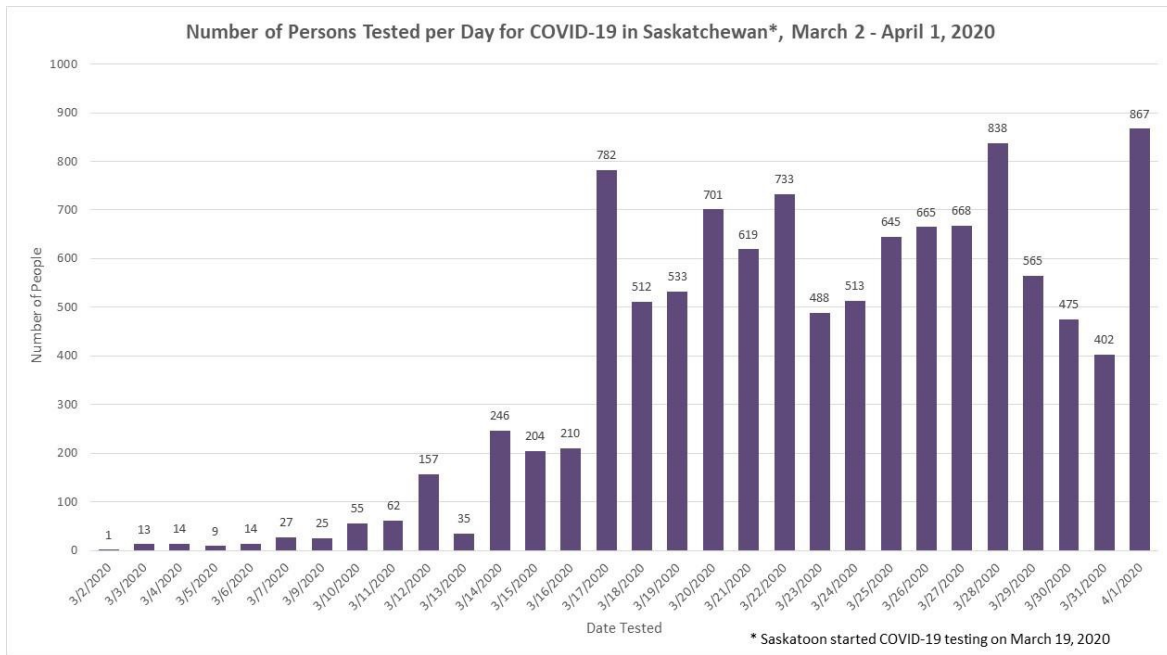
