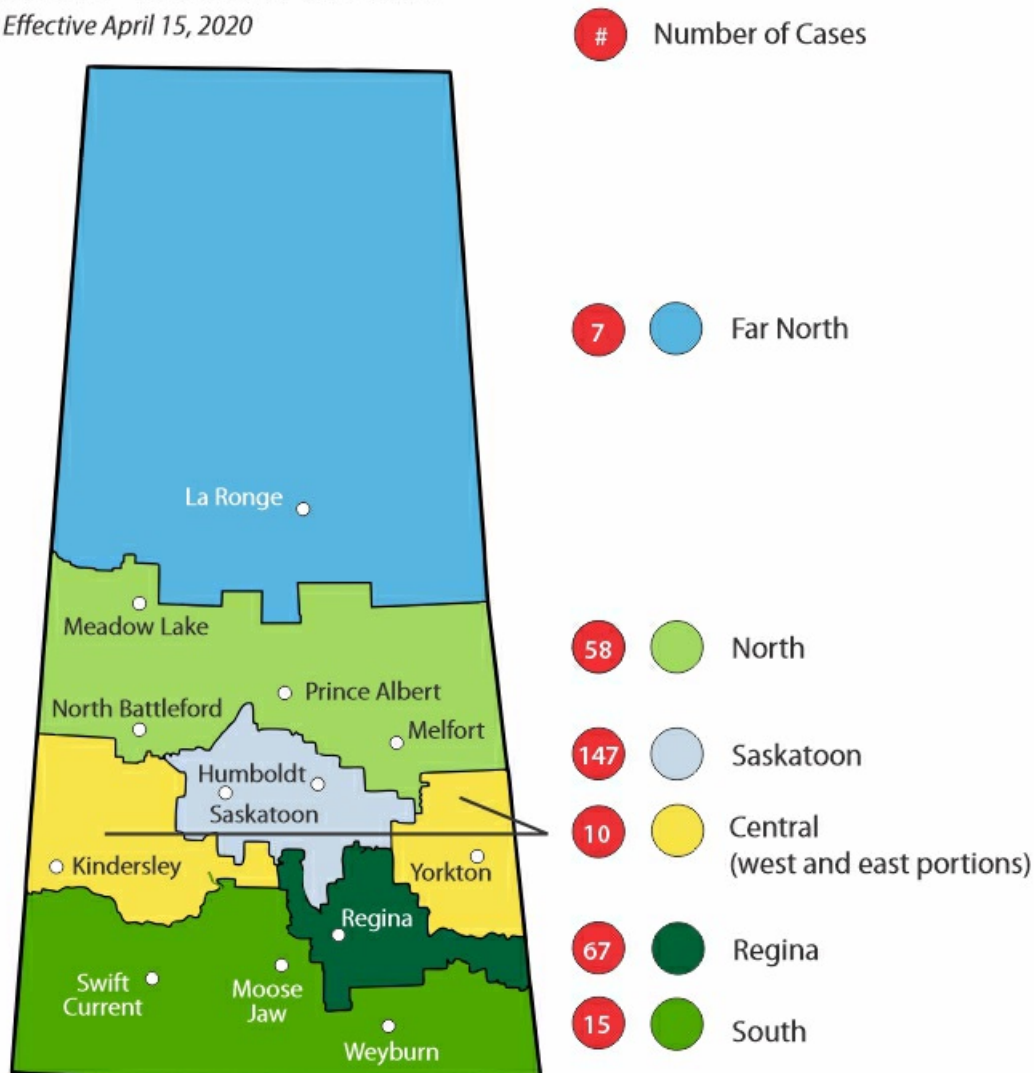


Cases and Risk of COVID-19 in Saskatchewan



COVID-19 Cases Per Zone

Effective April 15, 2020



As of April 15th, there are three (3) new confirmed cases, bringing the total to 304 reported cases of COVID-19 in Saskatchewan.

- No (0) new cases were Saskatchewan residents tested out of province
- 304 cases are confirmed and none (0) are presumptive (referred to RRPL/NML for confirmatory testing)
- 95 cases out of the 304 cases are considered active (31.3%)
- 147 cases are in the Saskatoon area, 67 cases are from the Regina area, 58 cases are from the north area, 15 cases are from the south area, ten (10) cases are from the central area and seven (7) cases are in the far north
- Twenty-two (22) of the cases are individuals in the 0-19 year old category; all others are adults, with 53% of the cases are males and 47% are females
- 43% (131) of cases are travel-related, 40% (122) are either contacts or linked to a mass gathering event, 10% (30) have no known exposures and 7% (21) are under investigation by local public health
- Thirty-four (34) cases are healthcare workers, although the source of their infections may not be health care related
- A total of eight (8) individuals are hospitalized; including eight (8) inpatient hospitalizations and none (0) in ICU hospitalization
- Four (4) Saskatchewan residents with COVID-19 have died. Saskatchewan now has a fatality rate of 1.3%
- A total of 205 individuals have recovered (67.4%)
- 20,907 COVID-19 tests had been performed in Saskatchewan.

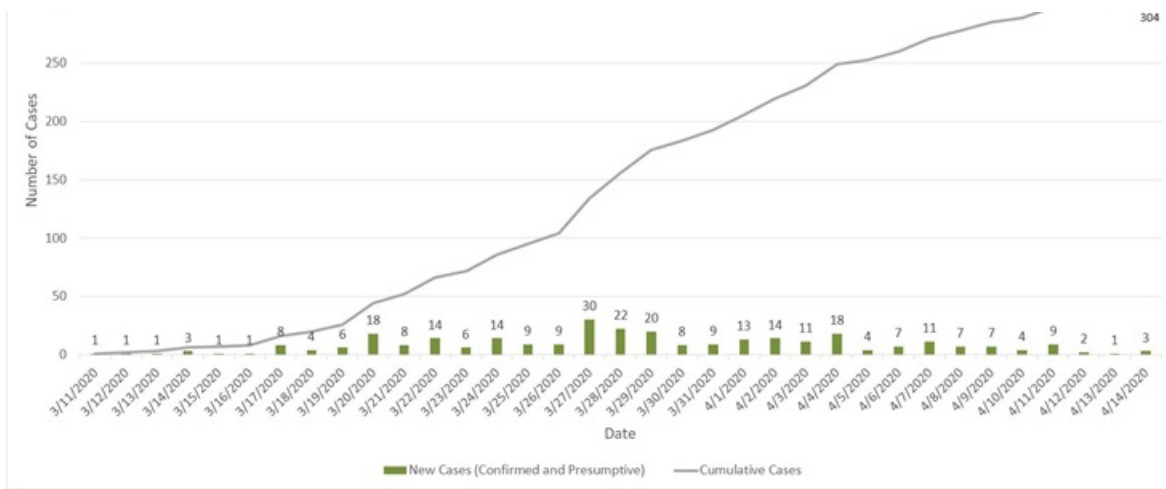

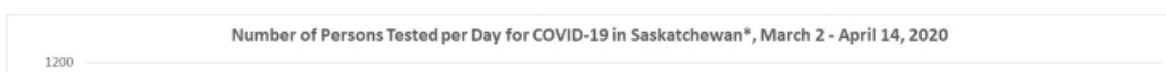

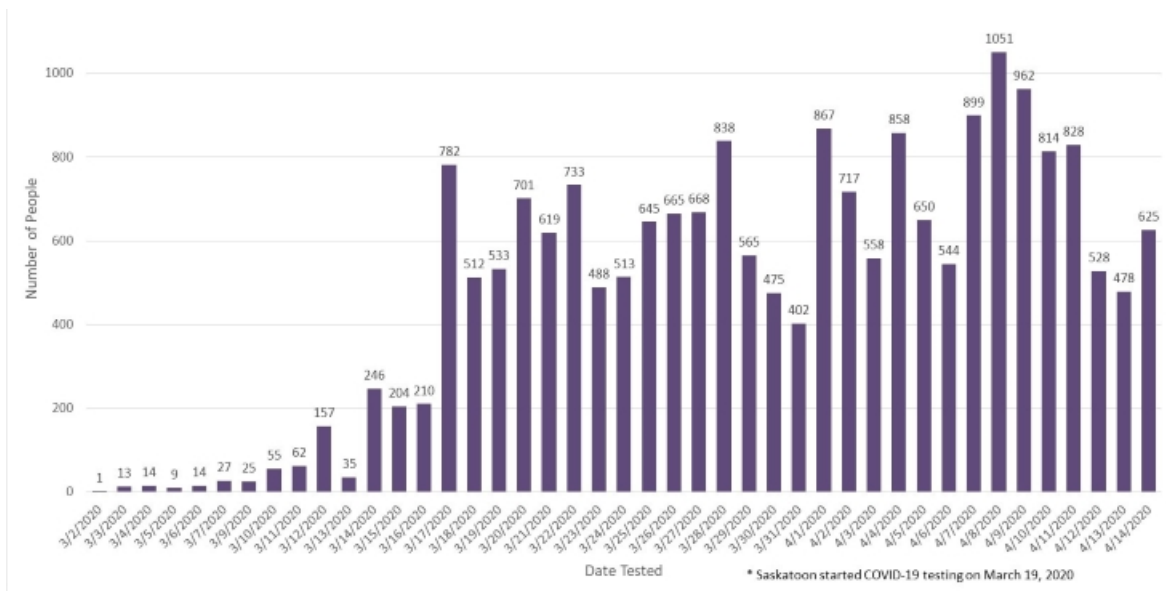
