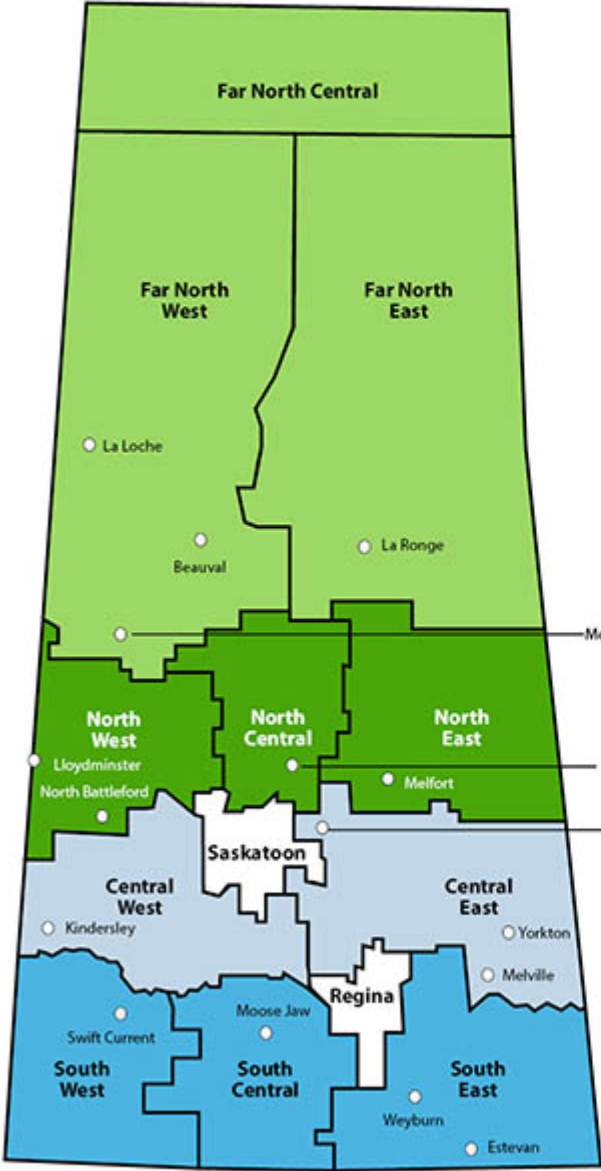

Note: The zones and sub-zones do not use the same geographic boundaries as the original six regions.

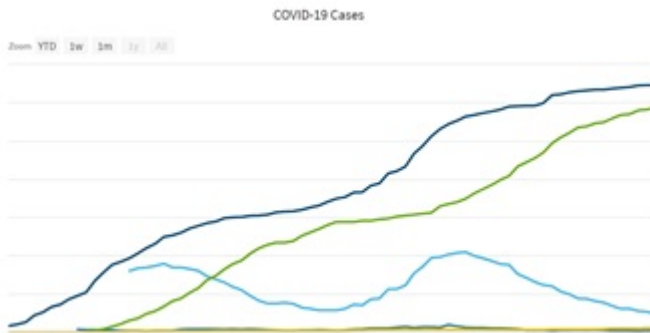

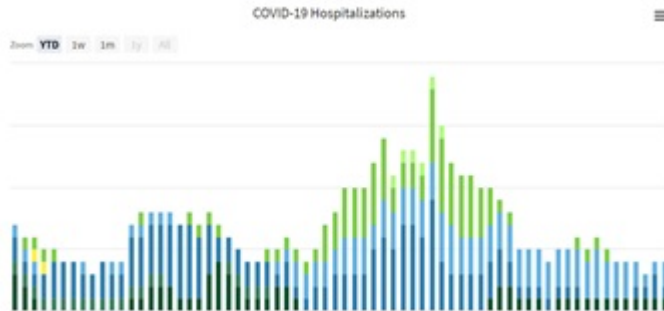
## Total number of tests performed in the province
