Due to the extensive information system failure today, only new cases reported by 8:30 on Thursday, 18 June, have been updated.

The epidemic situation in Finland has calmed down. From now on, THL will update the situation update only on weekdays, but will continue to monitor the situation closely. **The next situation update will be published on 22 June 2020.**

Due to the information system failure there may also be delays in updating the corona map in the coming days. The corona map will be updated daily

The situation in Finland in brief

Due to the information system failure only new cases reported by 8:30 on Thursday, 18 June, have been updated.

- Reported cases in total **7119** (+2)

Data may be updated retroactively.

The rest of the data in the situation update below have been updated on Wednesday, 17 June at 12:45

- Tested samples in total approximately **224,400** (+ 1900)
- A total of **326** (+ 0*) deaths associated with the disease have been reported.
- The number of patients in hospital care in Finland is **26** (+ 4*).
- The number of patients in intensive care in Finland is **2** (+ 0*).
- * Change from previous day. Newly reported cases are distributed retrospectively over several days. Also see [Reporting of information](#) below for information on reporting of data.
- In relation to Finland's total population (5,543,233), the prevalence of cases is **128** cases per 100,000 people.
- During the most recent seven-day monitoring period (8–14 June), **85** new cases were diagnosed. The incidence of new cases in relation to the population was **2** cases per 100,000 inhabitants. During the previous monitoring period (1.–7 June), the corresponding figures were 145 new cases, with an incidence of 3 cases per 100,000 inhabitants.
 - Reporting delays can affect the numbers stated for the most recent monitoring period. It is therefore not possible to draw any certain conclusions on the increase or decrease of cases on the basis of the most recent monitoring period.
- Virus testing currently has a capacity of over **13,000** tests per day.
- An estimated 6,200 people have recovered, which is around 85% of reported cases. The estimate is based on the follow-up of the observed cases over a period of three weeks (21 days). A person is considered to have recovered, when they do not have any follow-up data related to the progress of the illness after 3 weeks have passed from diagnosis. (Estimate updated on 11 June.)
