Minutes of the 5th Expert Committee Meeting for anticipated 3rd wave of COVID Pandemic held on 06.7.2021 from 2.30pm onwards in the Conference hall, next to Office of the Dean, Goa Medical College

The 5th Expert Committee (EC) Meeting was held on 02.07.2021, to deliberate and decide upon the Agenda matters shown below. The Chairman Dr Bandekar welcomed all EC Members and introduced the Special Invitees Dr. Viraj, Dr. Rataboli, Dr. Vaishali & Dr. Sunil. The Minutes of 4th EC Meeting which were previously circulated to all EC Members were passed and adopted. The Chairman requested Member Secretary to proceed with the Agenda for the Meeting. 16 Members attended; Dr. DSa, Dr. Usgaonkar & Dr. Harshad were granted leave of absence. The following matters were discussed & decided upon:

The EC took stock of the functional progress on ATRs by each concerned Department & Medical Associations. The Dept of Pediatrics, NGDH (Asilo), SGDH (Hospicio), the IAP Goa State Branch & IMA Goa State Branches submitted their Reports and were placed before the EC. Upon studying the Report submitted by Dr. Maria, HoD Pediatrics (Annexure-I), the Chairman requested her alongwith Dr. Sunil, Cardiac Anaesthetist/Intensivist to meet him the next day to discuss in detail regarding preparedness of all arrangements for Pediatric COVID cases at the new Super-Specialty Block (SSB) COVID Hospital GMC, before placing the functional progress before the upcoming State Task Force Meeting. Chairman informed that he has appointed a Staff Nurse to assist Dr. Maria at the SSB. EC accepted the suggestion of Dr. Jagadish for the appointment of a Nodal Officer from Dept of Pediatrics, GMC who shall ensure speedy setting up of all requirements for Pediatric COVID management at GMC, on similar lines as the duties performed by Dr. Viraj as Nodal Officer for Adult COVID.

The functional progress report: and time-lines of the NGDH, SGDH & IAP (Annexures-II, III & IV resply), were satisfactory and appreciated by the EC. The suggestion Dr. Jagadish that the Best Practices of the SGDH towards Bereavement Counseling, Group therapy, self-care for HCWs maybe emulated by other COVID Hospitals was accepted by the EC. It was observed that in their Progress Report (Annexure-V), the IMA had not specifically submitted the list of their Doctors willing to perform COVID duties at Government COVID Hospitals; however, IMA had submitted a fresh list of Doctors willing to do tele-consultation through IVRS with phone numbers & en ail IDs. Before deploying IMA Members for COVID duties, IMA Goa State President Dr. Buvaji suggested that the DHS & PHD may take appropriate timely decision in consultation with the IMA.

 EC Members Dr. Dhanesh & Dr. Gauns suggested that IVIG may be provided under DDSSY Scheme to private children's hospitals to treat moderate/severe COVID cases in children (MIS-C). They inquired whether the Government would be willing to provide IVIG to their Private Hospitals irrespective of whether Government beds were full or not. It was decided to place the matter before the State Task Force Committee for their decision. EC Member Dr. Sumant, Pediatric Intensivist who has treated such cases explained that the cost of IVIG treatment for a child with severe COVID ranges from Rs. 60,000 to 2 lakhs. EC requested the IAP to discuss and identify minimum 2 Hospitals (1 each North & South Goa) willing to offer COVID care for children by the next EC meeting.

- After a detail discussion, on the issue of availability of drugs to treat severe COVID in children & Mucormycosis, the EC decided to recommend to State Task Force Committee to ensure availability of the following MINIMUM buffer stocks during the Pandemic:
 - a. IVIG to manage severe COVID in children: 200 vials (each of ₱mg/kg dosage)
 - b. Liposomal Amphotericin B to treat Mucormycosis: atleast 1,500 vials (since minimum 70 vials are required per patient & there are around 20 cases undergoing treatment in Government / Private hospitals). This drug supply is centrally controlled and is unavailable in open market. Alternative drugs are not as effective.
- 4. As the curfew was being gradually lifted in Goa this week, it was observed by the EC from media reports & also through their own observations with dismay, that there was scant adherence to COVID appropriate behaviour by the tourists as well as the public at large. The EC unanimously resolved to recommend that besides ensuring strict implementation of the MoHFW SoPs recommended during previous EC Meetings, stringent penalty must be imposed by the Competent Authorities on Hotels & establishments, entrepreneurs, event managers, organizers and persons who flout the set norms of COVID appropriate behaviour placing lives of others in peril by spreading COVID.
- 5. The EC Members recommended that Government should consider granting appropriate financial / incentives to motivate & boost morale of Health Care Workers who have been actually working tirelessly at the various COVID Hospitals.
- As social responsibility of the EC, Dr. Jagadish circulated a draft Health Education flier for Parents to prevent and manage mild COVID in Children for their inputs & suggestions.

There being no further discussion, the Meeting ended with a Vote of Thanks by Member Secretary.

The list of consultants in the field of Medicine, Anaesthetists, and Pulmonologists has already been submitted earlier who had offered their services in the peak of second wave at various Govt, health centres.

In this month of July two state level CMEs are in the pipeline for preparedness of the unpredictable third wave which will involve pulmonologist and paediatric consultant for awareness and involvement by IMA Members in the COVID work in case.

I wish to inform that in the second wave private IMA Members were involved in the both COVID and non COVID work. 21 dedicated COVID hospitals in private sector were totally managed by private IMA members simultaneously offering their services in the crisis at SGDH, NGDH, ID nospitals CHCs etc. The members above 60 years were given some relaxation from direct COVID work. At the same time the non COVID work also was managed in the equal tone by private IMA Members which also had to be managed along with COVID work maintaining the balance. This was also the prime and equal need of the time during COVID. The health system in private was managed to near perfection by private IMA Members in COVID as well as non COVID and the full strength was devoted in the crisis.

In spite of this, in the eventualities of third ware the IMA Member from private sector would be on the fore front and would continue in the same calibre like second wave as per PHD guidelines and orders issued which would involve the specialists from Medicine, Anaesthetists and Pulmonologists as well as doctors from other specialties.

Regarding skill-based Training Programs I wish to request GMC, DHS, ESI to communicate the upcoming programs to be shared to all the IMA Members as the experts conducting programs are almost common on all platforms. This would help in non duplication of the topics and the experts speaking on the multiple platforms.

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Corona infection among children - Information for purents and public

- The severity of Corona infection among children when compared to adults has been less so far and bence there is no need to punic.
- Only when the adults in the family practice the following metics busdy—wearing
 mask, hand hygiene, social distancing and vaccination against Covid, we can prevent
 Corona solection among children in the family and protect them.
- 3. Lactating mothers should also get vaccinated against Covid;
- After delivery, even if the mother is Covid positive, buby and mother should not be separated.
- All bubies should be exclusively breastfed for the first six months irrespective of the Coxid status. Corona virus is usually not transmitted through breastmilk. In contrast, the buby will receive antibodies against Corona virus through breastmilk.
- The mother should wear a mask during breastfeeding. She should also keep her hands clean by frequently washing with soap and water or using sunitizer.
- All children should receive the vaccines mentioned in the National Immunization schedule at the specified age.
- 8. It is not necessary for children below 5 years to wear masks.
- Children infected with Corona may be asymptomatic. Some children can have fever, cough, cold or loose stools.
- 10. If a child infected with Corona virus does not have respiratory distress, he/she can be isolated at home. In case of respiratory distress, it is mandatory to seek medical advice and care.
- It is important to ensure that the affected children are not dehydrated. These children
 can be given more fluids like rice grack tender excount water, fruit juice in addition to
 nutritious diet.
- If the child has loose stools, home made or commercially available Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS) can be given.
- 13. Oral Paracetamol is enough for managing lever in children. Administering unnecessary medicines without appropriate medical advice can be dangerous.
- 14. In case the child also has other chronic problems like Asthma, Diabetes or Epilepsy, the concerned medications should be continued with medical advice
- 15 Children should avoid stepping out of the house unnecessarily. They should not be taken to overcrowded places.
- 16. Due to Corona pandemic and home confinement, children are likely to experience psychological problems like stress or depression.
- 17. It is advisable to reduce duity screen time for children (watching TV, celliphone, computer etc.). Unnecessary media information which is like to cause fear and pame need not be shared with children.
- 18 it is important that the parents sit down and freely interact with the children during this pandemic. All their concerns should be addressed diligently. In case the children long psychological issues, appropriate counselling and medical cure should be given.
- 19. Lo keep children active and happy, we can engage them in different games within the home. Their special talents should be identified and they should be encouraged to improve their skills in the areas of their choice.
- All of its should ecoperate with the Government so that we and our children are free of Corona scon.

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
