

Minutes of Meeting of the State Executive Committee held at the Forest Bhavan, on 3rd May, 2020

On 03/05/2020, a meeting of State Executive Committee (SEC) was held under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary (also Principal Secretary, PWD), Goa and the following other members of the SEC also attended:

1. Shri Puneet Goel, Principal Secretary, Science and Technology
2. Shri S.K. Bhandari, Secretary, Transport
3. Shri Sanjay Kumar, Secretary Revenue, Member Secretary, SEC & SDMA

The SEC was briefed about the reports on Law & Order, Trucks Movement, Relief & Shelters, and Covid Status Report (copy attached).

The other officers (as per the list Annexed), also attended the meeting as special invitees.

After deliberation on the current situation, the SEC noted and decided the following:

1. **Status of COVID19:** Secretary Health informed that no new Covid-19 case has been detected after 3rd April 2020. As on date, Goa has had seven positive cases of Covid-19, and all seven patients have recovered. After recovery, these patients were shifted to a Quarantine facility outside the Covid Hospital, as per norms for further quarantine. 194 tests for Covid (this includes tests done on the samples collected so far of those who were surveyed during the House-to-House survey), were done during the last 24 hours, on SARI/ILI patients, all of which were negative. The SEC noted with caution that Goa had not yet faced any community transmission.
2. Secretary, Health informed that the Health department has been parallely working on the routine immunisation programmes, various anti-malaria/dengue/chikungunya programmes, antenatal and all other regular medical services. OPDs have started in CHCs and PHCs and will start in District Hospitals from Tuesday. Erection of three temporary structures is required to operationalise OPDs at GMC to comply with MHA's direction on social distancing and safety norms. The SEC directed the MD, GSIDC to expedite the work.
3. Secretary GAD informed that the department has issued a circular for working of Govt establishments with all requisite safeguards. From Monday, the departments should observe regular attendance with social distancing and safety measures.
4. The SEC discussed the movement plan for the persons who were stranded due to lockdown. The SEC directed that the priority should be given to persons who are in distress, as clarified by the MHA on 3rd May, 2020. Shri Kunal, the Nodal Officer, presented the SOP and informed about the preparation made so far, especially for

cleaning of data received from different sources for removal of duplicates, etc. The SEC advised him to coordinate with other States for smooth movement of people.

5. Secretary, Health informed that she has readied a team of around 100 health workers who would be placed at various locations as per need to take the samples of the incoming people. Collector South to make a holding area at Fatorda stadium, which is near the South District hospital/Hospicio.
6. Commissioner (Excise) informed that the liquor manufacturers have produced about 4.85 lakh liters of hand sanitisers. He further informed that the Excise department has also issued orders to permit opening of the manufacturing units, wholesale and retails shops subject to restricted timings (not beyond 6 pm) and after adherence of social distancing, availability of hand sanitizers, and compulsory use of masks, etc.
7. Commissioner (Excise) informed that the Excise department has seized unauthorised stock of liquor worth Rs. 81 lakhs in 26 cases booked since the lockdown began.
8. Secretary, Civil Supply informed that ration distribution is going on normally. Distribution of pulses has started for all categories. At some places, lifting of stock by FPS owners is in smaller lots due to paucity of space in that particular FPS.
9. Director, Panchayat informed that data collection is going on in all Panchayats. Out of the over 46,000 labour that was contacted by the Village Panchayats, about 90% have expressed desire to go back to their home State. The SEC advised him to share the data with Sh Kunal, the Nodal officer, on a regular basis.
10. MD, KTCL informed that 30 relief buses were operational today. The SEC decided that use of these buses should be rationalised further as normal public transport services are likely to resume from Monday.
11. Director, Education informed that the department is starting a four-day training programme for master trainers from 5th May, who in turn will train other teachers from 13th May. The training will equip the teachers with the latest technological tools that would improve the learning outcomes in their classes and promote use of e-classes.
12. Secretary, Agriculture informed that the agricultural activities are normal. With 12 Harvesters working in the fields, 86% harvesting is complete and sowing for vegetables is complete in about 186 hectares (5% of usual) and is likely to pick up gradually.
13. The SEC discussed the request of the private dental practitioners. In their representation, they have submitted that they would do only emergency procedures at the clinics wherein equipment that generates aerosols will not be used and they would also strictly adhere to all the safety protocols. The representation further added:



- a. Patients will be assessed for Covid symptoms prior to appointments and also re-assessed prior to commencement of treatment.
- b. There will be an interval maintained between the completion of the patient treated and the next patient accepted to enforce social distancing and asepsis at the operatory.
- c. All DCI guidelines will be strictly adhered with respect to Covid19.

The SEC agreed to allow opening of the private dental clinics with the above restrictions.

14. DMA informed that he has issued necessary orders for the opening of the markets, with the restrictive timings as earlier directed by the SEC to ensure the compliance of MHA's directives.
15. The Nodal Officer for Quarantine facilities informed that a total of 288 persons are sheltered in nine quarantine facilities. He is visiting these facilities regularly.
16. IGP informed that the police have so far taken action in 3319 cases for non-wearing of masks or spitting at public places. The SEC advised the continuation of the strict action in this regard.
17. Secretary, Panchayat informed that Panchayats have issued 1960 permissions for different permitted activities, on which about 5654 workers are engaged.
18. MD, KTCL raised the issue of testing and quarantining of bus drivers/cleaners after returning to Goa after performing a duty outside the State. The SEC decided that the testing of such drivers/cleaners shall remain compulsory, however, after testing negative, they can resume normal duties.

Committee also conveyed to all concerned that as per MHA orders, any person violating these containment measures or not complying with the above directions will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action u/s 188 of the IPC.

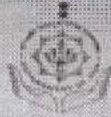
