

Minutes of Meeting of the State Executive Committee held at the Forest Bhavan, on 5th May, 2020

On 05/05/2020, a meeting of State Executive Committee (SEC) was held under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary (also Principal Secretary, PWD), Goa and the following other members of the SEC also attended:

1. Shri Puneet Goel, Principal Secretary, Science and Technology
2. Shri S.K. Bhandari, Secretary, Transport
3. Shri Sanjay Kumar, Secretary Revenue, Member Secretary, SEC & SDMA

The SEC was briefed about the reports on Law & Order, Trucks Movement, Relief & Shelters, and Covid Status Report (copy attached).

The other officers (as per the list Annexed), also attended the meeting as special invitees.

After deliberation on the current situation, the SEC noted and decided the following:

1. **Status of COVID19:** Secretary Health informed that no new Covid-19 case has been detected after 3rd April 2020. As on date, Goa has had seven positive cases of Covid-19, and all seven patients have recovered. After recovery, these patients were shifted to a Quarantine facility outside the Covid Hospital, as per norms for further quarantine. 200 tests for Covid (this includes tests done on the samples collected so far of those who were surveyed during the House-to-House survey), were done during the last 24 hours, on SARI/ILI patients, all of which were negative. The SEC noted with caution that Goa had not yet faced any community transmission.
2. Secretary, Health informed that the department has started the training for additional personnel required for enhancing the capacity of the swab taking team for Covid testing in case of a need in future. She also added that GoI has allocated a stock of TrueNAT kits for Covid testing to the State and has also dispatched 5,000 PPE and N95 masks.
3. Secretary, Health informed that all OPDs have started operating, including at GMC. In these OPDs, people would be able to access normal health services. She further informed that the Health department has simultaneously been working on various immunisation programmes, various anti-malaria/dengue/chikungunya programmes, antenatal and all other regular medical services.
4. The SEC discussed the issue of inter-state movement of migrants. Shri Kunal, the Nodal Officer, informed that the team is working on a plan to facilitate their movements. The SEC decided that the plan needs to factor in the prioritisation of distressed people as per the MHA's guidelines.



5. Collector, South-Goa informed that they are in touch with Madhya Pradesh authorities for the movement of the migrants of that State. He has shortlisted about 750 migrants who could be sent in the first train. He also added that the district is facing issues in registering the migrants on Karnataka's portal due to requirements of Aadhar details. This issue is more acute for the labourers currently housed in Shelter Homes as some of the labourers either do not have their Aadhar card or are not registered.
6. The Nodal Officer for Quarantine facilities informed that a total of 239 persons are sheltered in 11 quarantine facilities. He is visiting these facilities regularly.
7. The DIG informed that some migrants became restive at Mapusa due to some misinformation, which has been suitably handled. He also added that the department has visited the various Railway stations and have done their assessment for smooth handling of the incoming/outgoing passengers using the special relief trains.
8. PCE(PWD) informed that water supply is normal, including at Bambolim where water supply was restored last night after the requisite repairs.
9. The SEC discussed the ongoing repair work of the approach road of Mandovi river bridge (Atal Setu) which had developed some defects. GSIDC informed that the repair work would be complete by 30th May. The SEC advised the GSIDC to ensure timely completion of the repair work.
10. Commissioner (Excise) informed that the department was able to meet the previous year's revenue target. He also informed that the sanitisers production has stabilized and there is no shortage in the local market.
11. Secretary, Civil Supply informed that the department has initiated action against three FPSs, who were not lifting the stock for distribution under PMGKY. She further added that the regular distribution of ration has picked up the pace in the rest of the State.
12. The SEC asked the Collector, North-Goa to streamline the process of entry of vehicles at Patradevi, in view of the long waiting period at this border checkpoint. The Collector informed that she is working on this to improve the efficiency of the existing process, for reducing the waiting period. The SEC asked the District Observers to monitor the same.
13. Secretary, Law informed that the Registration process has picked up and the department has registered 39 documents and 32 marriages during the day. The SEC advised the department to keep the process staggered to ensure the social distancing and other safety norms.
14. Secretary, Ports informed that the associations of owners of barges have agreed to pay for the Covid tests but want to get their crew quarantined for 14 days onboard



the barges. The SEC advised him to spell out a proper SOP keeping in mind the instructions issued by the MHA in this regard.

15. Secretary, Agriculture informed that the agricultural activities are normal. With 12 Harvesters working in the fields, 88% harvesting is complete, and sowing for vegetables is on.

Committee also conveyed to all concerned that as per MHA orders, any person violating these containment measures or not complying with the above directions will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action u/s 188 of the IPC.
