

Minutes of Meeting of the State Executive Committee held at the Forest Bhavan, on 10th May, 2020

On 10/05/2020, a meeting of State Executive Committee (SEC) was held under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary (also Principal Secretary, PWD), Goa and the following other members of the SEC also attended:

1. Shri Puneet Goel, Principal Secretary, Science and Technology
2. Shri S.K. Bhandari, Secretary, Transport
3. Shri Sanjay Kumar, Secretary Revenue, Member Secretary, SEC & SDMA

The SEC was briefed about the reports on Law & Order, Trucks Movement, Relief & Shelters, and Covid Status Report (copy attached). The other officers (as per the list Annexed), also attended the meeting as special invitees.

After deliberation on the current situation, the SEC noted and decided the following:

1. **Status of COVID19:** Secretary Health informed that no new Covid-19 case has been detected after 3rd April 2020. As on date, Goa has had seven positive cases of Covid-19, and all seven patients have recovered. After recovery, these patients were shifted to a Quarantine facility outside the Covid Hospital, as per norms for further institutional quarantine of 14 days, and they all have thereafter been sent for home quarantine as per laid down protocols. 324 tests for Covid (this includes tests done on the samples collected so far of those who were surveyed during the House-to-House survey), were done during the last 24 hours, on SARI/ILI patients, all of which were negative. The SEC noted with caution that Goa had not yet faced any community transmission.
2. Secretary, Health shared that she has reviewed the process of holding people, who are coming from outside Goa, in quarantine centers, till the test results are received. The time taken in discharging people even after receipt of the test reports, and time taken in disinfecting their rooms can be rationalised to maximise use of quarantine centres. She has advised the Health Officers and Quarantine in-charges to put a mechanism in place accordingly.
3. The SEC discussed the possibility of developing a protocol to carry out testing during night. This will help the people who are quarantined and waiting for test results to be discharged in the morning. The SEC asked the Health Secretary to work on this line.
4. The SEC advised the Collectors to explore the possibility of having designated holding areas such as stadiums or large halls for people to wait for about 5 to 6 hours, till their test results are received.
5. Secretary, Health informed that the university has requested for using a government quarantine centre for a few university students who came from outside and have tested

negative, as these students are housed in a hostel with common facilities. The SEC permitted the use of International Centre, Goa as the quarantine facility.

6. The Nodal Officer for Quarantine facilities informed that a total of 336 persons are sheltered in 11 quarantine facilities. He is visiting these facilities regularly.
7. CE(Elect) informed Powergrid technicians/officials who have arrived to undertake the departmental work have been tested. However, the report is still awaited. These technicians/officials will be deployed on the departmental worksite, subject to guidelines issued by the MHA in this regard.
8. CE(WRD) informed that the work of providing the raw water supply to Mopa airport project would be completed within a week.
9. MD, KTCL informed that 88 buses were in operation today. Two buses, on their return from Udaipur, has brought back 20 persons. He has also got a request for sending four buses to Kochi, Kerala on payment basis. The SEC allowed the movement of these four buses, with due safety precaution.
10. JS, Revenue, the Nodal officer for the NRIs, informed that two flights are likely to land after about a week with about 350 passengers at Goa airport. The SEC advised the Collector, South-Goa to make arrangements for the paid Quarantine facility and necessary transportation arrangement. The SEC advised Secretary Health to work on the testing protocols for such cases, to expedite their test results while they are waiting at the airport. Shri PS Reddy, IAS, Secretary Goa will coordinate the movement of all such stranded passengers who are coming to Goa airport from outside India, as is being done for the case of seafarers coming through the port route.
11. Secretary, Agriculture informed that the agricultural activities are normal. With 12 Harvesters working in the fields, 93% harvesting is complete and sowing for vegetables is going on and is likely to pick up gradually with the onset of Monsoon.
12. Secretary, Civil Supply informed that the regular NFSA quota has been distributed to 85 % of AAY and 76% of PHH card holders. Further, PMGKAY rice and dal has been distributed to 71% of AAY and 61% of PHH beneficiaries. Trucks challan for 94% of FPSs has been issued for lifting of PMGKAY rice; a good progress after show cause notices were issued.

Committee also conveyed to all concerned that as per MHA orders, any person violating these containment measures or not complying with the above directions will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action u/s 188 of the IPC.
