

Minutes of Meeting of the State Executive Committee held at the Forest Bhavan, on 15th May, 2020

On 15/05/2020, a meeting of State Executive Committee (SEC) was held under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary (also Principal Secretary, PWD), Goa and the following other members of the SEC also attended:

1. Shri Puneet Goel, Principal Secretary, Science and Technology
2. Shri S.K. Bhandari, Secretary, Transport
3. Shri Sanjay Kumar, Secretary Revenue, Member Secretary, SEC & SDMA

The SEC was briefed about the reports on Law & Order, Trucks Movement, Relief & Shelters, and Covid Status Report (copy attached). The other officers (as per the list Annexed), also attended the meeting as special invitees.

After deliberation on the current situation, the SEC noted and decided the following:

1. **Status of COVID19:** Secretary Health informed that 514 tests were done for Covid (this includes tests done on the samples collected so far of those who were surveyed during the House-to-House survey for SARI/ILI patients), during the last 24 hours, and all were negative.
2. Chairman, SEC informed that the State Government has put in a request to the Railways, to not operate any train terminating at Goa, as these trains get a large number of passengers to Goa, some of whose end destination is other neighbouring States, which jeopardises the overall gains obtained by Goa from lockdown.
3. Secretary, Health and Collector South informed that arrangements have been made to take the throat swab samples of the passengers of the incoming special train terminating at Madgaon tomorrow, at the new South District Hospital.
4. Shri Kunal, the Nodal officer informed that the Inter-State Movement Cell has sent bulk SMSs, as directed by the SEC earlier, to the incoming train passengers who are coming in the scheduled Rajdhani train that will terminate at Margao tomorrow. He further informed that one Shramik express train has left for Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh today, with 1464 passengers. Another Shramik express train is planned to leave for Una, Himachal Pradesh tomorrow.
5. Collector, North-Goa sought clarification regarding permits for inter-State movement of passengers for being able to board the scheduled trains starting from Margao, Goa on Sunday. The SEC clarified that the MHA guidelines permit movement of passengers who

have confirmed e-tickets. However, care should be taken so that such passengers should come straight to the railway station after entering the State borders, and be kept at safe distance from others with face covers etc at the railway station, and the driver of their vehicle should return back to their State immediately thereafter.

6. Collector, South-Goa informed that 828 passengers are coming by train tomorrow and they will be taken to Fatorda stadium by buses after their throat swab samples are taken at the new South District Hospital. He also requested for postponement of the planned shutdown by the Electricity department for annual maintenance for the South district. The SEC asked CE(Electricity) to make the suitable arrangements to restore the power supply latest by 1 pm, before the arrival of the passengers to the Hospital.
7. Secretary, Law informed that the department has registered 66 documents and 14 marriages during the day. The SEC advised the department to keep the process staggered to ensure the social distancing and other safety norms.
8. The Nodal Officer for Quarantine facilities informed that a total of 423 persons are sheltered in 19 quarantine facilities.
9. JS, Revenue requested for more information from the Collectors on the hotel room to be registered on the MEA portal for the passengers coming from abroad by air. The SEC asked the Collectors to provide the requisite information. MD, KTCL informed that the bus transport would be provided from Airport to Hotel by the KTCL at a uniform charge of Rs. 500/- per passenger. He further requested for the clarification about the people of other States who would come in the flights. The SEC clarified that as per MHA guidelines/instructions, all passengers landing at Goa, would undergo compulsory testing and 14 days quarantine at their own cost. The passengers of other States could make their own arrangements for journey to their States after landing (and after Covid test reports are received) if they obtain advance written permission from their States.
10. PCE(PWD) informed that the water supply is adversely affected at Tillary due to disruption in power supply in view of the inclement weather. The water supply to the rest of the State is normal.
11. Shri Keshav Kumar, District Observer informed that he visited Keri border post and traffic flow was found to be smooth.
12. MD, KTCL informed that 167 buses were operational today. Three buses were sent to Gadag, Karnataka with migrants. On Saturday and Sunday, public transport would only provide minimal services due to reduced demand. He has made arrangements to pick passengers coming to Airport and drop them to their designated Hotel anywhere in Goa, at a uniform rate of Rs. 500 per passenger.



13. Secretary, Agriculture informed that the agricultural activities are normal. With 8 Harvesters working in the fields, 97% harvesting is complete, and sowing for vegetables is on.
14. Director, IT informed that 19983 people have moved out of the State and 2633 have entered since 29th April 2020.
15. The Nodal Officer (Foreigners) informed that till date 7648 foreigners have left Goa in 37 special ferry flights from the Goa Airport.
16. The SEC discussed the requirement of the tents to be converted into semi-permanent structures, in view of the onset of the Monsoon, as these posts would continue to be operational. The SEC asked the PCE (PWD) to take up this work on top priority.
17. Collector, North-Goa informed that food charges at Quarantine may be collected by the facility in-charge posted by the Collectors. The SEC asked the Secretary, Tourism to issue suitable instructions to GTDC and streamline the working of these quarantine centres, in coordination with the Collectors.
18. Secretary, Ports informed that 154 seafarers have come to Goa and are quarantined in the designated Hotels. These seafarers have tested negative at Mumbai, however they will undergo another round of testing at Goa.
19. Secretary, Civil Supply informed that 88% of PHH and 92% of AAY card holders have been distributed regularly and PMGKAY rice and APL rice has been lifted by 99% of the card holders.

Committee also conveyed to all concerned that as per MHA orders, any person violating these containment measures or not complying with the above directions will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action u/s 188 of the IPC.
