Minutes of Meeting of the State Executive Committee held at the Forest Bhavan, on 26th May, 2020

On 26/05/2020, a meeting of State Executive Committee (SEC) was held under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary (also Principal Secretary, PWD), Goa and the following other members of the SEC also attended:

- 1. Shri Puneet Goel, Principal Secretary, Science and Technology
- 2. Shri S.K. Bhandari, Secretary, Transport
- 3. Shri Sanjay Kumar, Secretary Revenue, Member Secretary, SEC & SDMA

The SEC was briefed about the reports on Law & Order, Relief & Shelters, and Covid Status Report (copy attached). The other officers (as per the list Annexed), also attended the meeting as special invitees.

After deliberation on the current situation, the SEC noted and decided the following:

- Status of COVID19: Secretary Health informed that 536 reports were received for Covid tests (this includes tests done on the samples collected so far of those who were surveyed during the House-to-House survey for SARI/ILI patients), during the last 24 hours, and all were negative. Nine patients were cured and shifted out of Covid hospital. The total number of active cases is 39.
- 2. Secretary, Health informed that two flights have landed today, with 42 passengers. Many of them are undergoing testing. Shri Kunal, the Nodal Officer, informed that two trains departed today, one for Orissa and another to Jharkhand with 1322 and 1628 passengers respectively. He informed that train bound for Orissa could not get the capacity numbers, thus, currently trains planned to Orissa are being postponed.
- 3. Secretary, Health informed that many homeless, who were brought to the testing facilities by the police after booking them for various illegalities, are left at GMC and have nowhere to go after their testing is done at the Health facilities. DIG informed that their legal status is 'out on bail'. The SEC asked the DIG to send them to the shelter homes, if they are homeless.
- 4. Secretary, Health asked the Collectors to make arrangements for institutional quarantine for the people violating Home quarantine. She also requested for designating the existing toilet facilities for male/female and also provide for rainproof tents, at the border checkposts. The SEC asked the Collectors and PCE(PWD) to take the necessary corrective steps immediately.
- 5. Secretary, Health informed that Goa needs more quarantine facilities for the recovered patients as more patients may recover soon. The SEC asked the Secretary, Tourism to earmark another GTDC facility for such Quarantine purposes.

- 6. The Collector, South-Goa informed that trains may start making halts at more stations in Goa, as per the information received from the Railways authorities. The SEC asked the Collector, South-Goa to liaise with the Railways authorities to ensure no non-scheduled stop in Goa and to prevent unauthorised deboarding of the passengers at locations other than designated railway stations. The Railways authorities be made responsible for adhering to this protocol.
- 7. Secretary, Law informed that the department has registered 67 documents and 20 marriages during the day. The SEC advised the department to keep the process staggered to ensure the social distancing and other safety norms.
- 8. The SEC discussed the suo-moto order dated 26 May, 2020 of the Supreme Court of India, on problems related to stranded migrants labourers. The SEC asked Secretary Law and Secretary, Revenue Goa to compile all information on the various welfare measures taken by the State Govt for these stranded migrant labourers and the same be presented before the SC. Ld AG may be requested to indicate a Counsel for this case and provide all support for preparing the affidavit.
- 9. The Nodal Officer for Quarantine facilities informed that a total of 899 persons are sheltered in quarantine facilities.
- 10. Secretary, Port informed that 272 seafarers are expected to come in a flight from Italy on 29th May 2020.
- 11. MD, KTCL informed that 149 KTCL buses were operational today. He further informed that six buses are planned for Kerala for transporting persons stranded in Goa. The SEC permitted these bus trips outside of Goa.
- 12. The SEC was informed that Margao market was not properly regulated today. The SEC asked the DMA to make the arrangements for the orderly operation of the market while following all health safeguards such as social distancing, masks, etc.

Committee also conveyed to all concerned that as per MHA orders, any person violating these containment measures or not complying with the above directions will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action u/s 188 of the IPC.
