Global Epidemiological update

The number of global cases is at the highest level since the beginning of the pandemic for the last two weeks. The increase in global cases is mainly driven by the marked increase in both cases and deaths in South East Asia. Mild increase was also observed in the Western Pacific region. Other regions have reported decrease in both cases and deaths. 155 million people have been infected with more than 3.2 million reported deaths.



India reports highest number of weekly cases globally

The country reported 27,28,622 new cases and 25,753 deaths in the past week. As per WHO situation report, India currently accounts for 46% of global cases and 25% of deaths.

Maharashtra, Karnataka, Kerala, Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan have the highest number of active cases currently.



ONE SUPERSPREADER EVENT REPORTED FROM A RELIGIOUS EVENT IN MON

A Church revival camp held between 21 - 25 April 2021 turned into a super spreader event in Mon District as **45 persons have tested positive out of 69** samples with a positivity rate of 65%.

Testing and contact tracing is still underway. The district administration has directed all attendees to self-isolate and turn up for testing.

Social and religious events are high risk factors for such superspreading events.









DAILY COVID-19 CASE INCREASE WITH 7 DAY MOVING AVERAGE




WEEKLY COVID -19 TESTS DONE THROUGH RT-PCR, TRUENAT & RAT FROM 01 JAN 2021

COMORBIDITIES ASSOCIATED AMONG COVID-19 DEATHS IN NAGALAND




Diabetes and hypertension are the most commonly associated comorbidities among the deaths in the state. Hence, vaccination of high risk was prioritised.

More than one comorbidity can be associated with a patient.






