



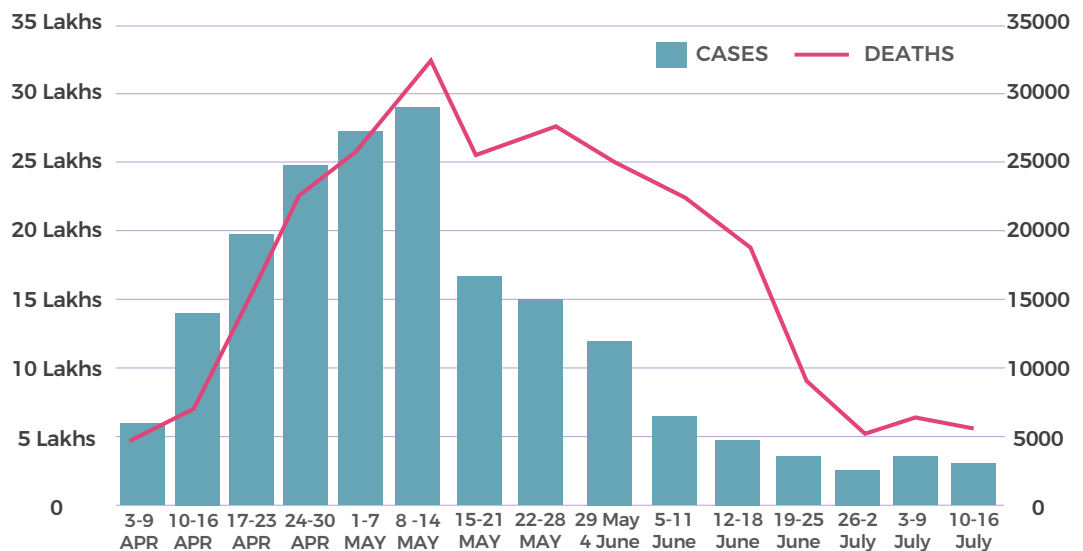
Global Epidemiological Update

All regions across the globe have reported an increase in the number of cases except the Americas. Maximum increase in deaths has been observed in the African region. Almost a quarter (24.7%) of the World's Population has received at least one dose of the Covid-19 Vaccine as per WHO situational report. However, access to vaccines remains a challenge in many countries.

Next 100-125 days Critical: NITI Aayog

There has been no noticeable decline in daily cases and deaths for the last 4 weeks in the country and NITI Aayog has raised concern for the same. 26.9 lakh cases and 5,946 deaths were reported from the past week.

Out of 41 districts with more than 10% sample positivity rate in the country, 31 are from the Northeastern states with 9 from Manipur.

99.5% of Covid-19 deaths in Nagaland are not fully vaccinated

From March 2021 till date, only 2 out of 404 Covid-19 deaths have been found to be fully Vaccinated (2 weeks completed after second dose).

88% of deaths were not vaccinated even by a single dose and even among those who were vaccinated by a single dose, it is not determined yet if 2 weeks had passed after the vaccination. COVID-19 vaccines have targeted the most high-risk groups initially and the protection seen in real time even among the high risk groups is very significant.

With the delta variant in circulation, it is highly advisable to get the second dose for full protection and remain very cautious till the full vaccination is completed.

Preliminary evidence suggests that both doses of a COVID-19 vaccine are needed to provide adequate protection against the Delta variant.

One SUPERSPREADER EVENT reported from a funeral service in Mokokchung

24 out of 46 contacts were tested positive after attending a funeral service in Mokokchung with a positivity rate of 57%. Superspreading events are the main drivers of this pandemic and maximum precautions should be taken to minimize them. Any social gathering is a high-risk event.

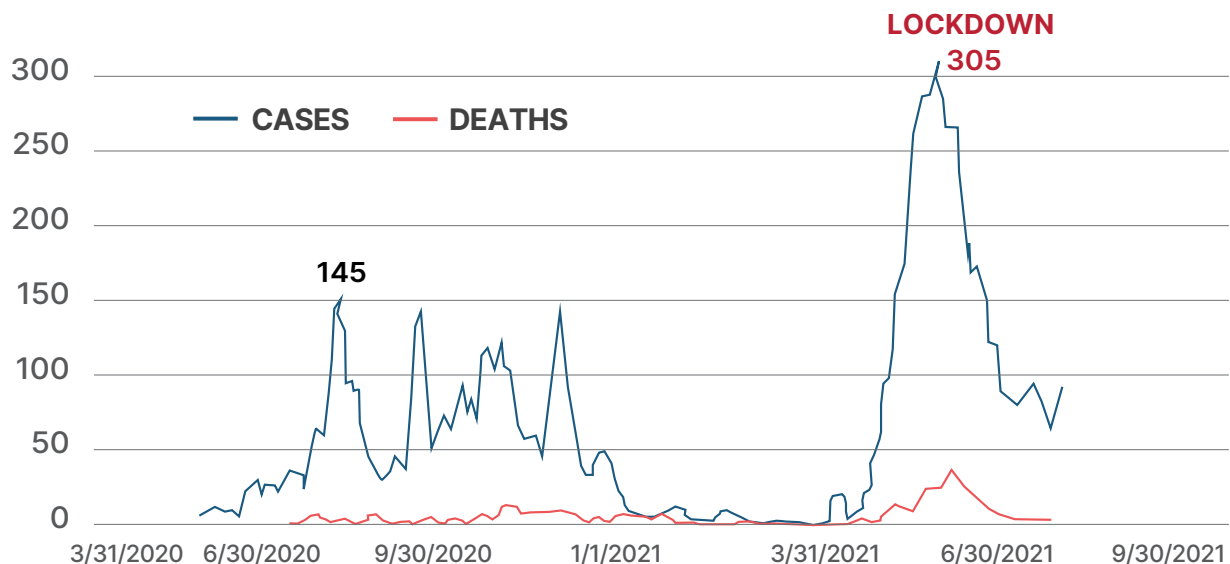
The community should strictly follow the following measures at funerals:

- ▶ Limit number of people as per State SOP (50 for funerals)
- ▶ Double masking, Physical distancing and handwashing to be strictly enforced.
- ▶ Unavoidable services should be held in an Open space or an area with adequate natural ventilation.
- ▶ Avoid any gatherings to the extent possible
- ▶ Practice staggering of timings if visits are unavoidable.
- ▶ High risk individuals should avoid any social gathering.

- There has been an increase in weekly new cases compared to the previous week. 689 new cases were reported compared to 405 cases the past week. Weekly new cases have increased for the first time in 7 weeks. The state remains yet again at an overly critical juncture.
- The weekly sample positivity rate also increased to 8% from 6% last week. **Four districts have reported a weekly positivity rate of more than 10%**

- There were 79 admissions to COVID-19 hospitals in the past week. Hospital admissions are remaining constant for the last 5 weeks and do not show a decline.
- 6.60 lakh doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been administered across the state and 44% of eligible beneficiaries (18+ population) have received at least one dose. **More than 70% of the population is still susceptible to COVID-19 infection and vaccination needs to be ramped up urgently along with strict maintenance of COVID-19 appropriate behaviors.**
- 2090 people with 'student' as occupation has been tested positive in 2021.

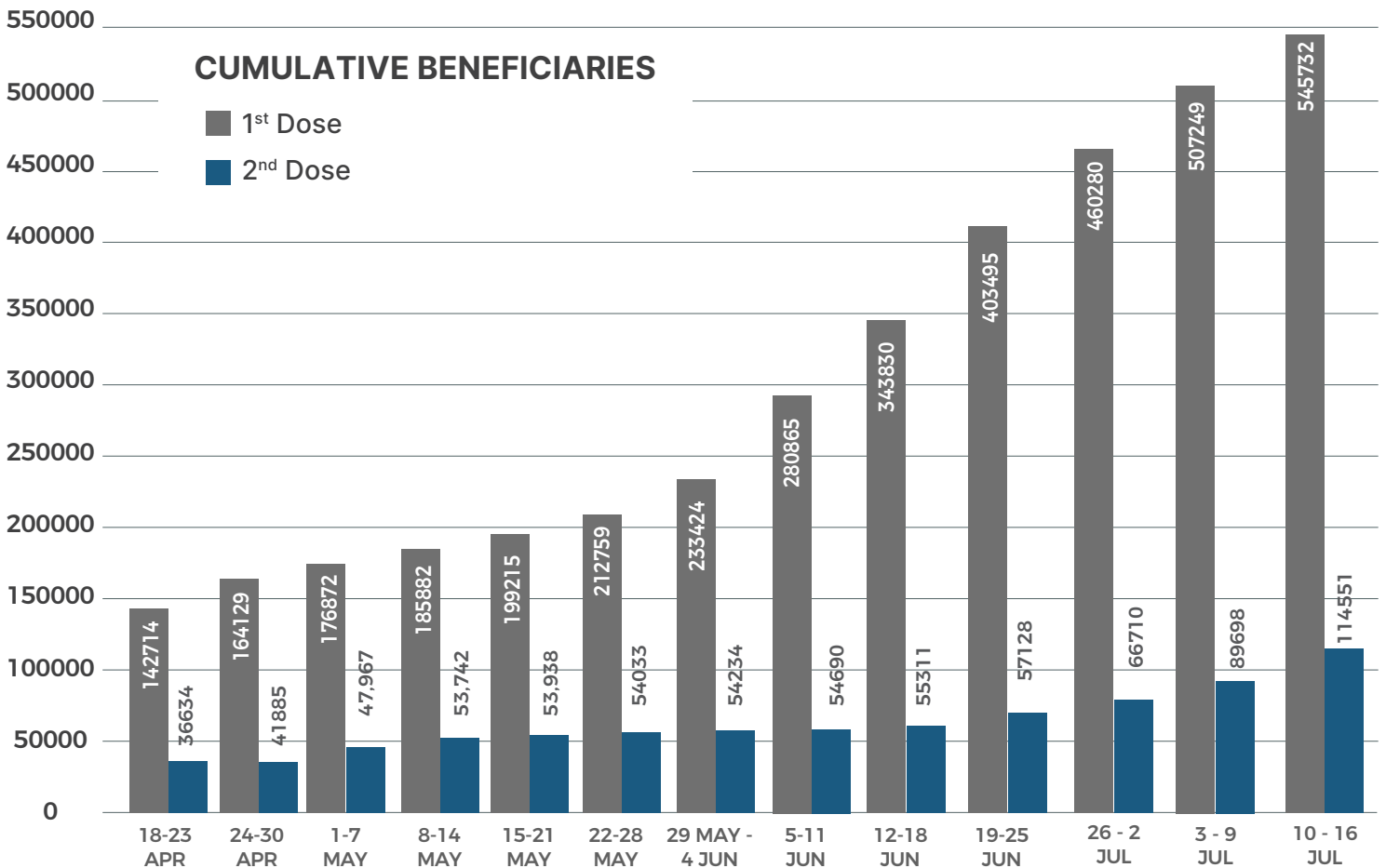

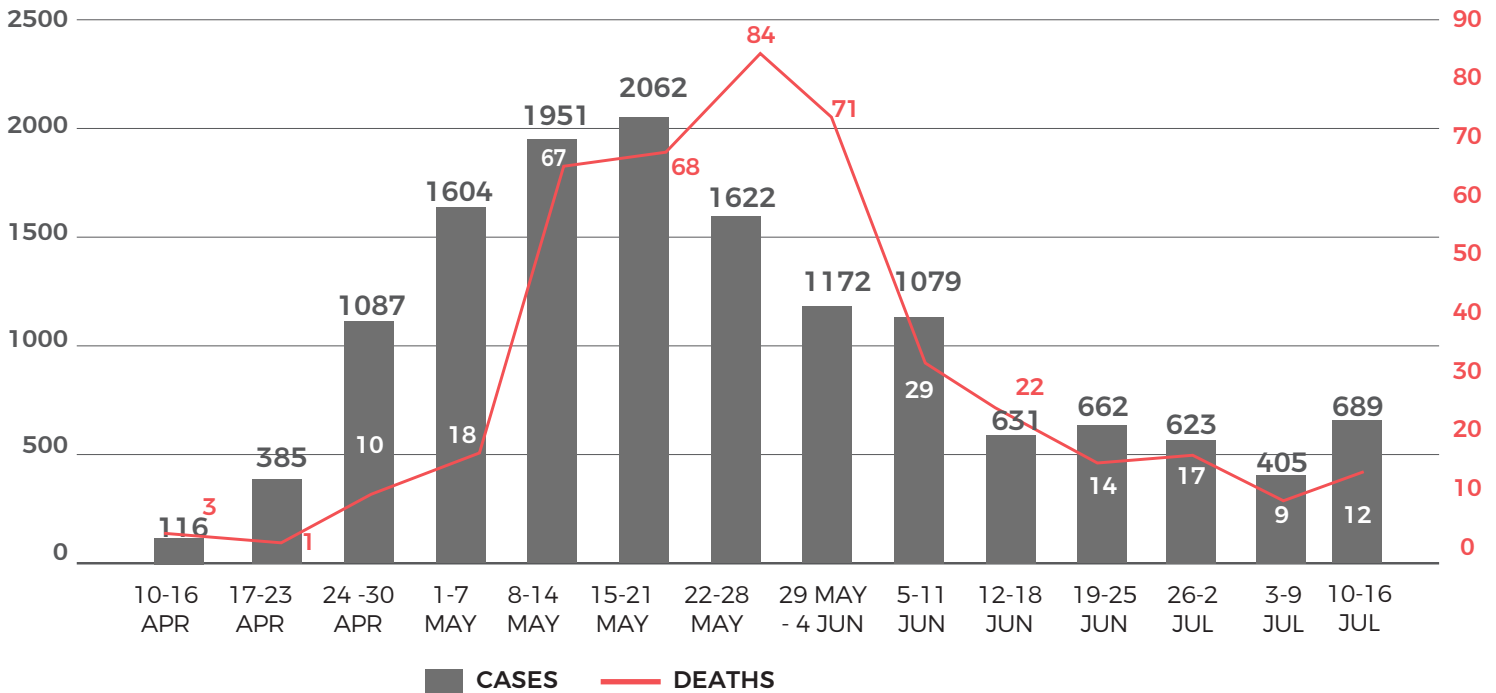

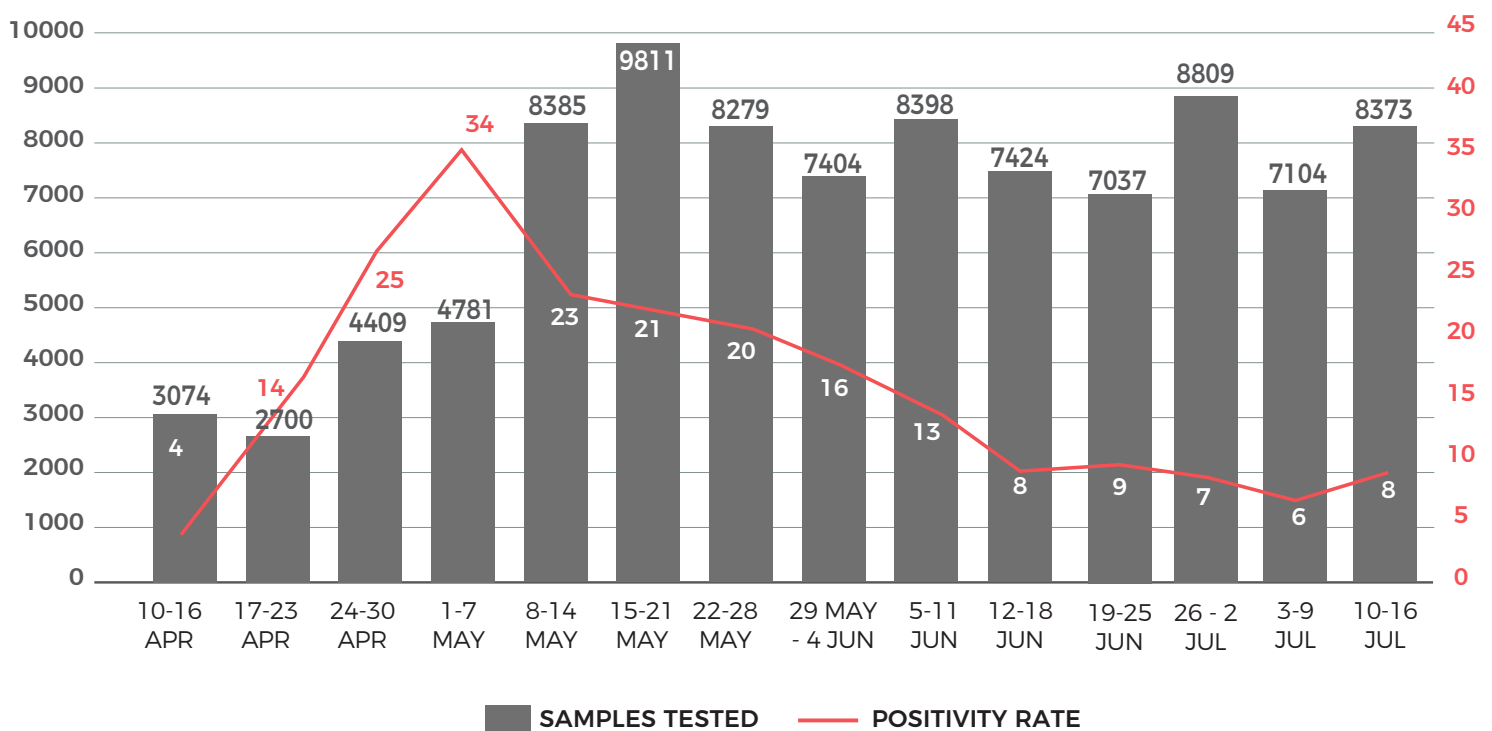

- Stringent adherence to universal masking for staff and students matched by hand hygiene, physical distancing, adequate ventilation.

- Vaccination of teachers, non-teaching staff and eligible students should be prioritised.

- Level of community transmission in a district should be the key parameter to guide reopening.

- High level of testing and contact tracing within schools.

- Classroom routines redesigned to limit student interaction inside and outside the rooms.

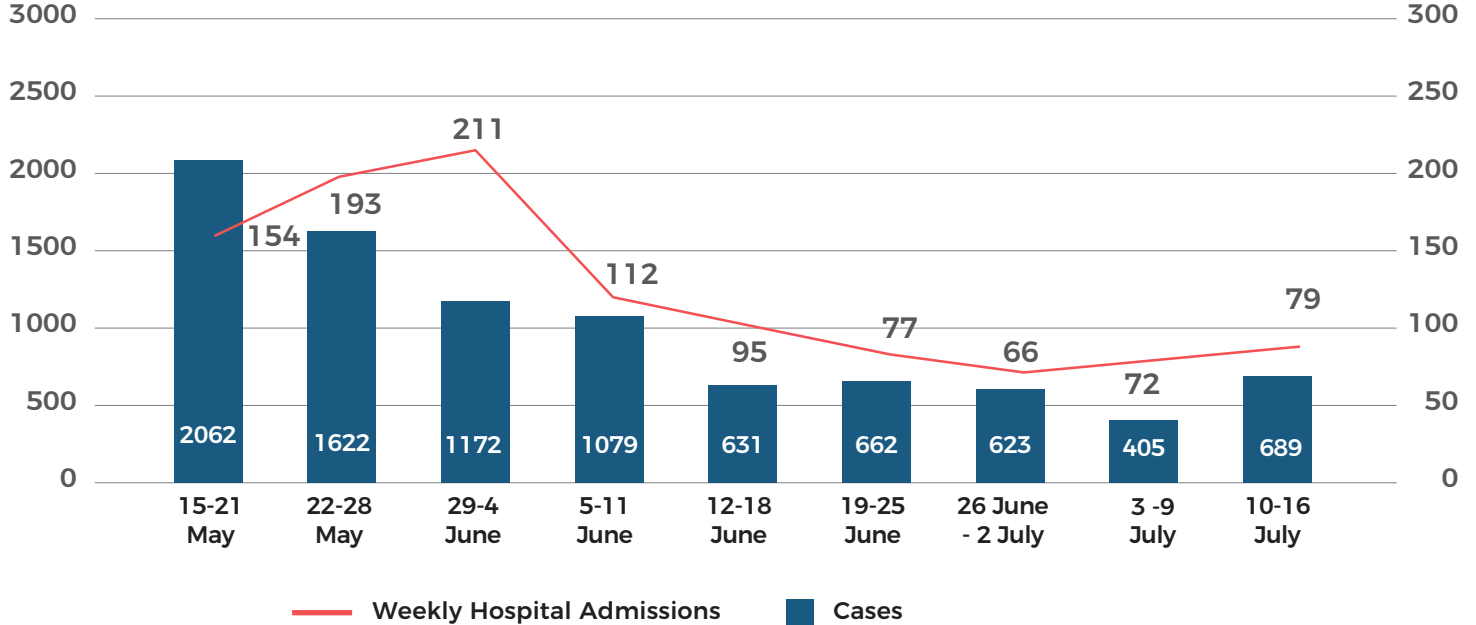

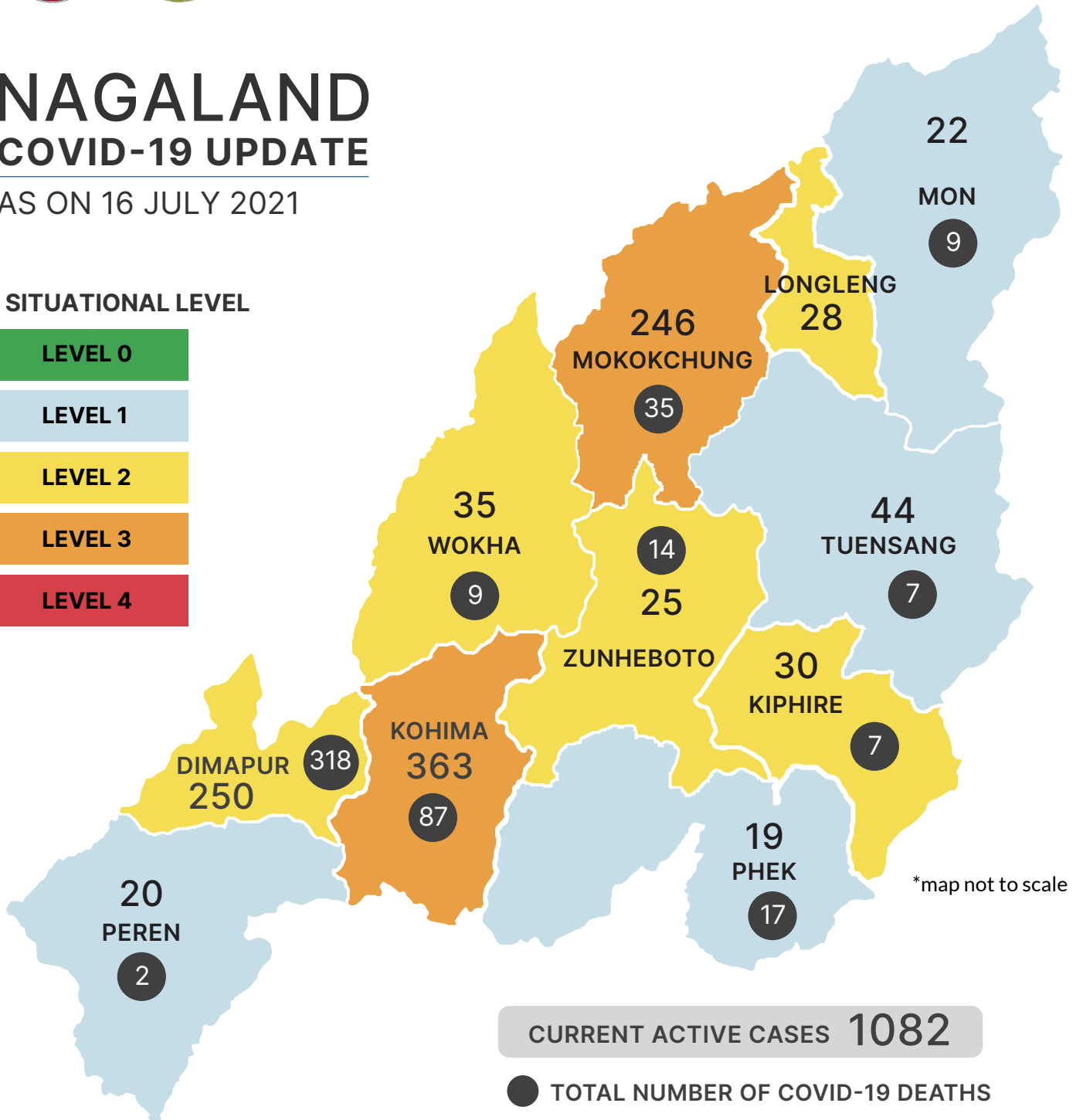

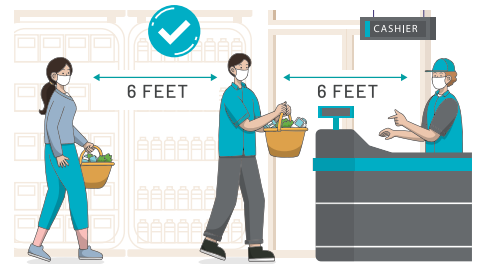
