

COVID-19 WEEKLY BULLETIN



Global Epidemiological update

COVID-19 cases continue to increase for the fourth consecutive week globally as confirmed cases reach 125 million with more than 2.7 million deaths. The highest number of cases are reported from Brazil, USA, India, France and Italy. Hospitals across Brazil are on the brink of collapse and 24 states out of 26 have 80 % of the ICU beds occupied as per a report in the BMJ. It also mentions the Pandemic is causing “the biggest health system collapse in the history of Brazil.”

India: Rise in Covid cases continue after touching lowest mark in mid February

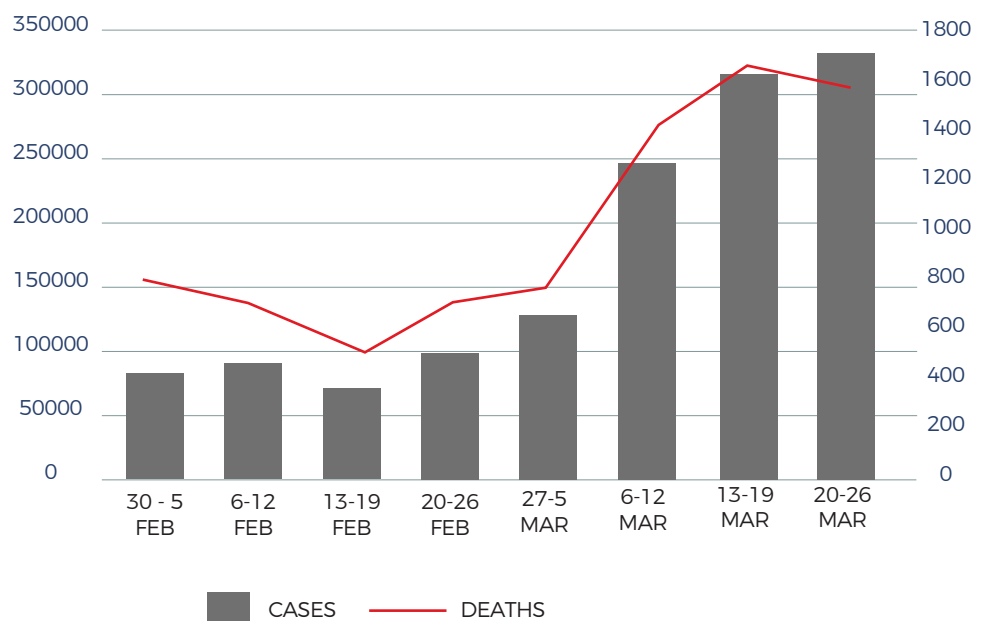
Maharashtra, Punjab, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Chhattisgarh and Chandigarh are reporting the maximum cases.

Maharashtra is witnessing record cases per day for the past week as the state goes for night curfew from 28 March 2021 to curb the spread.

“I do not wish to impose lockdown. But there seems a possibility of healthcare facilities falling short given the rise in the number of coronavirus patients,”- CM, Maharashtra

The country has reported more than 3.3 lakh cases in the past week.

ASTRAZENECA VACCINE

prevents 100% severe COVID-19 disease, 79% of symptomatic disease

A study carried out in the US and published in the British Medical Journal shows the AstraZeneca vaccine or COVISHIELD in India is 100% effective in preventing severe disease and admission to hospitals. It also found no increased risk of blood clots by the usage of the same vaccine.

All citizens 45 years and above can get Vaccinated from 1st April 2020

1. Vaccinating as many as possible in the shortest amount of time and achieving maximum population immunity in the wake of the emerging COVID-19 scenario is critical.
2. The COVID-19 Case Fatality Rate or death rate for 40 years and above is 2 % against the overall 0.66% in the state. 70 % of the deaths are above 45 years and the median age of deaths is 55 years. This necessitates the inclusion of the 45 plus age groups.

ALL TRAVELLERS AND RETURNEES SHOULD ADHERE TO the standing state SOP for returnees and travelers as on 25th Nov 2020.

(No. NSDMA-ER-COVID-19/301/2020 (pt-II))

With the emerging COVID-19 situation in the country and the increase in the number of variants, all travelers coming to Nagaland should strictly observe the laid down SOP to avoid any importation of cases. All citizens must do everything to avoid a second wave.

1. Any traveler with a Negative RT PCR test done not earlier than 72 hours before arrival will be exempted from quarantine.
2. All travelers coming to Nagaland without a negative test report must observe 10 days quarantine (Home or paid), unless exempted under SOP.
3. Travelers who wish to shorten quarantine period should opt for testing and if negative can be released from quarantine.
4. All symptomatic travelers will be tested as per protocol
(More details can be found in SOP)

Travelers should strictly follow the 3w's and monitor symptoms.

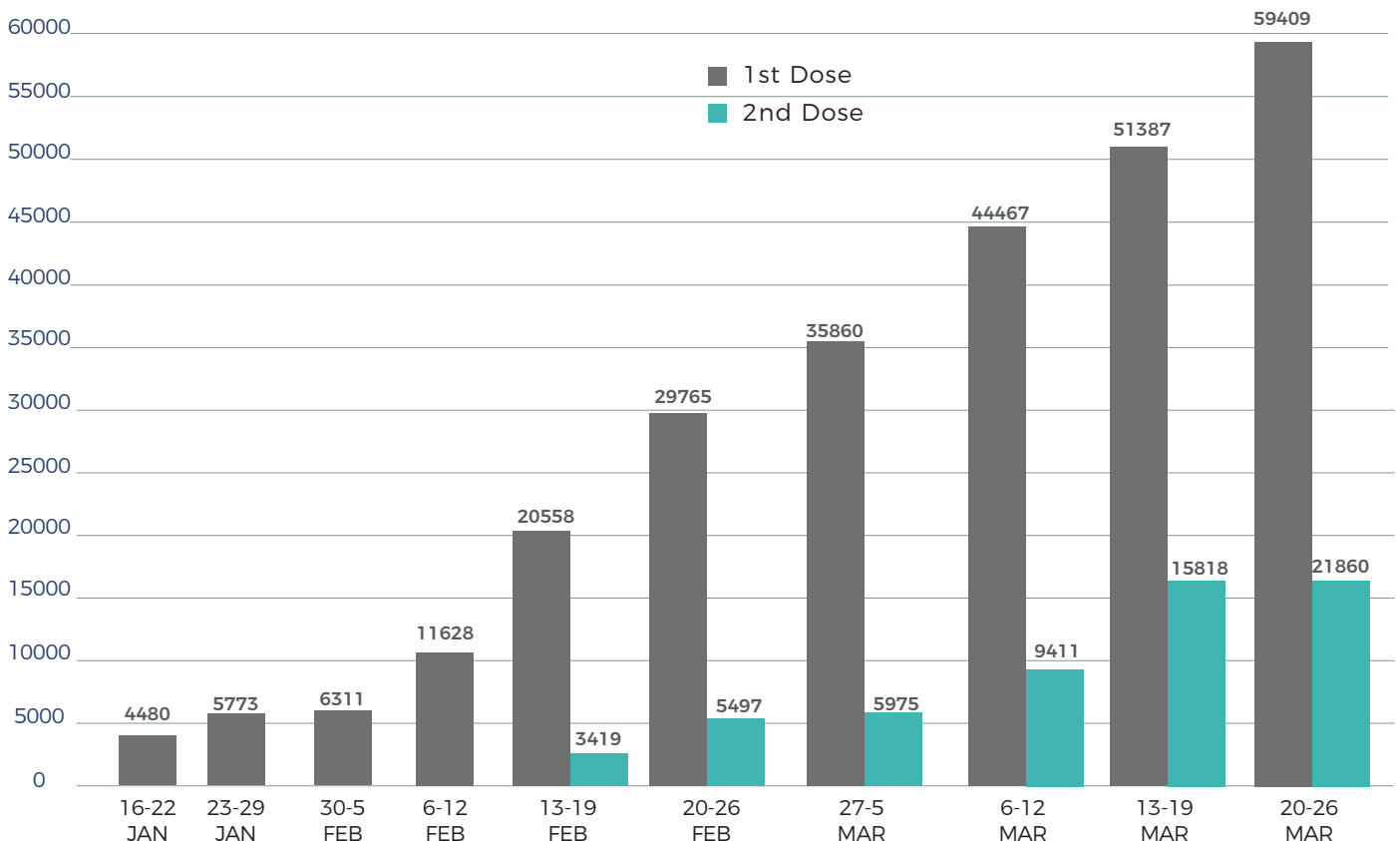

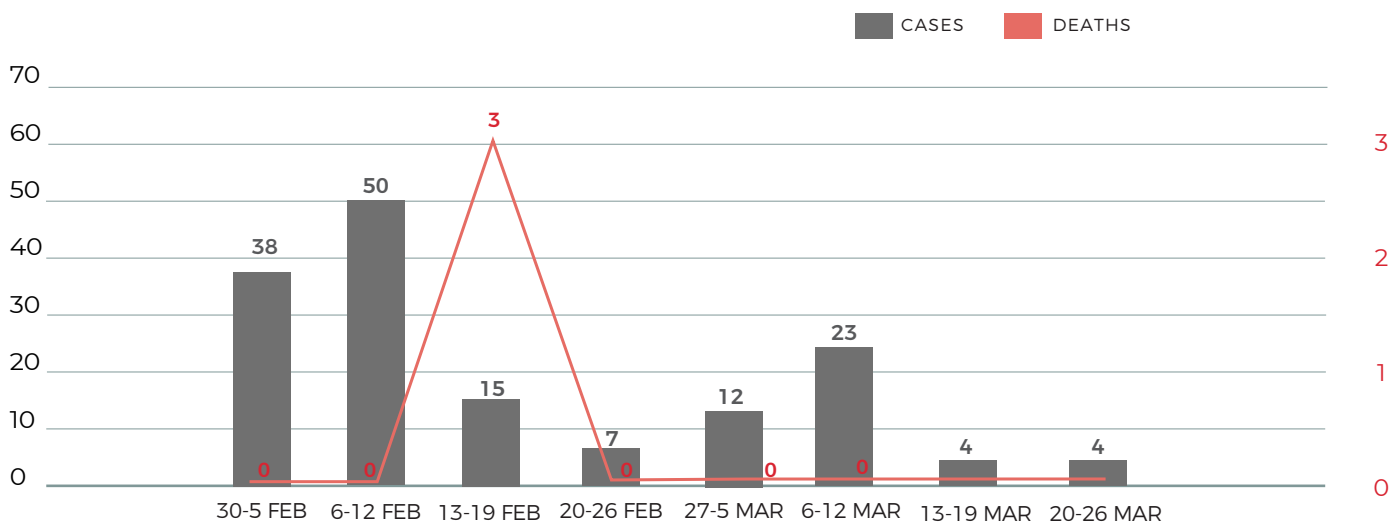
TOTAL BENEFICIARIES



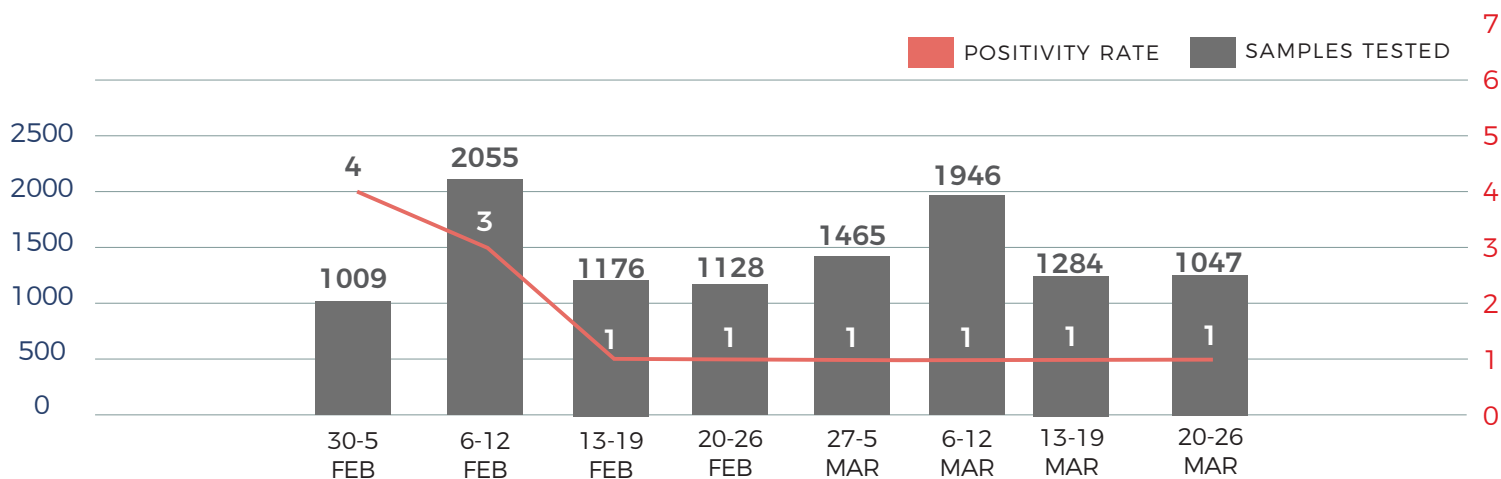

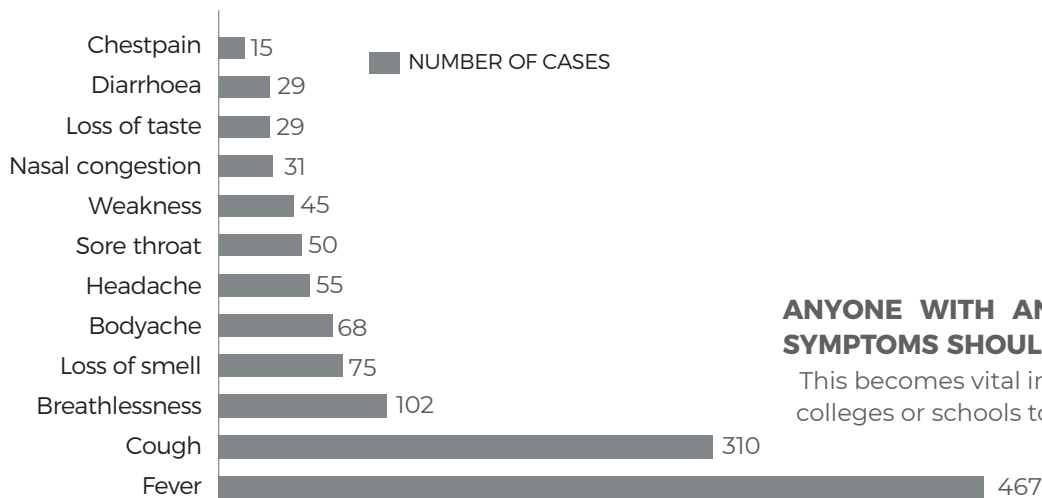
COVID DEATHS SUMMARY

All COVID-19 deaths are certified by the state death committee as per ICMR and WHO ICD 10 guideline.

- Total Deaths: 81
- Median Age: 55 yrs
- Range: 24 - 90 yrs
- Gender: Males 73%
- Deaths with comorbidities: 84%
- Most common comorbidities: Hypertension & diabetes

84% of deaths have associated comorbidities like diabetes, hypertension, chronic kidney and liver diseases, heart diseases etc.

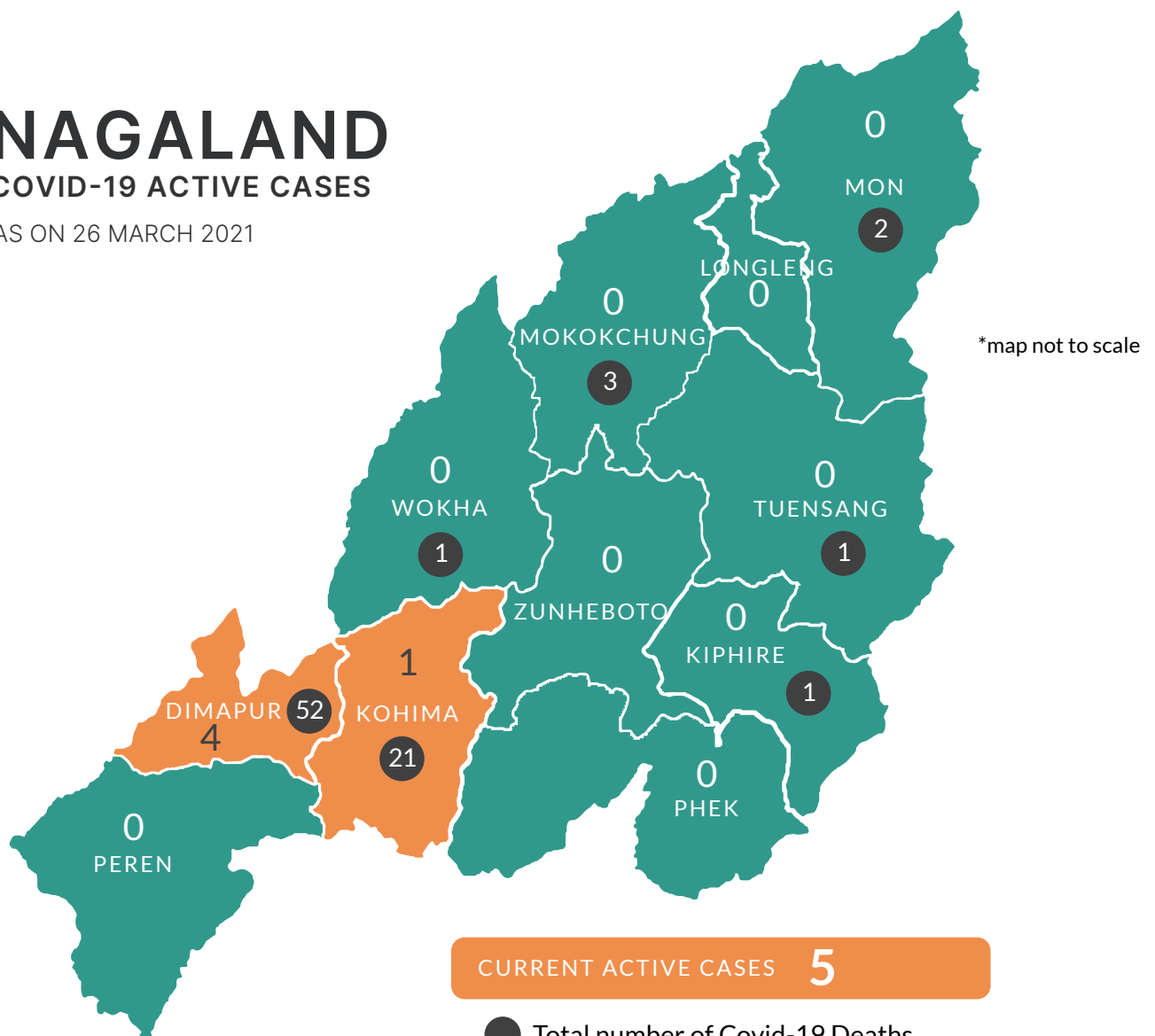

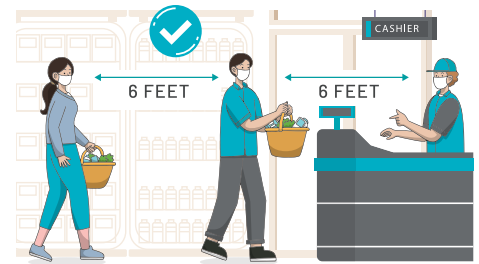

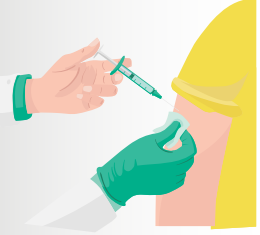
