

COVID-19 WEEKLY BULLETIN



Global Epidemiological update

Global cases continue to increase for the fifth consecutive week and deaths have shown an upward trend in the last two weeks. More than 4 million cases and 71,361 deaths were reported in the past week. 129 million people have been infected with more than 2.8 million deaths across the globe. Brazil, USA, India, France and Poland reported the highest number of cases in the past week. 628 million doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been administered globally in 177 countries (Bloomberg). COVAX has distributed 32 million doses to 61 countries.


India: Covid cases surge for 6th consecutive week, GOI says situation is 'critical'

The country has recorded a 37% increase in new cases from the past week with the highest cases reported from Maharashtra. More than 4.5 lac cases and 2,447 deaths were reported from the week with a death rate of 0.5 %. Deaths usually follow 2-3 weeks after increase in cases. "While the country was reporting about 97,000 daily new COVID cases at the peak of the pandemic in September 2020, the country has now reached the critical figure 81,000 daily new cases of COVID", GOI stated.

One superspreader event reported, as State records highest single day spike in last 6 months

Kohima reported one Superpsreader event as 132 cases were reported from the past week. The outbreak from a training Institute in Kohima sends a clear message that such events can happen anywhere when necessary conditions are met.

What we know of superspreader events

All Superspreader events in the state have been reported from ENCLOSED and CROWDED places with maximum face to face human interactions.

Research says ***superspreader events are the main drivers in this pandemic as 10% of superspreaders are responsible for 80% of cases.*** Superspreader events are where one case can infect many people disproportionately.

Where can these superspreader events occur?

Such events have been observed in confined, enclosed spaces with poor natural ventilation and where COVID-19 appropriate behaviors can be compromised like ***offices, schools, prisons, places of worship, trainings, meetings, restaurants, crowded markets, public transport and large public events.***

Superspreader events can be avoided by

1. Prompt isolation and testing of anyone with even the mildest of symptoms.
2. Compulsory wearing of mask.
3. Opening of doors/ windows for adequate natural ventilation.
4. Staggering of church timings/ religious events to ensure 2-meter physical distancing along with usage of digital platform.
5. Alternate day routine for schools to ensure 2-meter physical distancing as in SOP
6. Event managers to ensure crowd management, physical distancing and COVID-19 appropriate behaviors are enforced strictly.
7. Provision of handwashing points/ hand sanitizers in all high-risk settings.

VACCINE PASSPORTS

“Certifications of vaccination that reduce public health restrictions for their bearers” is under process in many countries. Australia, Denmark, and Sweden have committed to implementation; and Israel, which leads the world in per capita vaccination, is already issuing “green passes” to vaccinated residents. USA, UK and the European Union are considering the same.

CASE FATALITY RATE OR DEATH RATE OF 45 YEARS AND ABOVE IN THE STATE IS MUCH HIGHER AT 2.6 % THAN THE OVERALL RATE OF 0.66%. VACCINES OFFER THE BEST CHANCE AGAINST SEVERE DISEASE OR DEATH AND ALL ELIGIBLE CITIZENS SHOULD GET PROTECTED AT THE EARLIEST.






TOTAL BENEFICIARIES



MONTHLY TESTING & POSITIVITY RATE




MONTHLY PERCENTAGE OF RT PCR (BSL), TRUENAT & RAPID ANTIGEN TEST







This becomes vital in high-risk settings like offices, colleges or schools to avoid a super spreader event


