Global Epidemiological update

Global weekly cases have increased after a consecutive decrease for 6 weeks. As per WHO situation reports, there has been a weekly 7% increase due to surge of cases in Eastern Mediterranean, South East Asia, Europe and the Americas.

“Possible reasons for this increase include the continued spread of more transmissible variants of concern (VOCs), relaxation of public health and social measures (PHSM) and fatigue around adhering to PSHM measures.”

MoHFW releases new SOP on Preventive Measures

The country is seeing an increase in cases for the last two weeks with Maharashtra, Kerala, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Gujarat and Karnataka accounting for more than 80% of the cases.

The Ministry of Health has released new SOPs on preventive measures in Restaurants, Gymnasiums, Shopping malls, Places of worship, Training and higher technical institutions, Hotels and Entertainment parks.

Complacency around COVID-19 appropriate behaviors and other relaxations of Public Health and social measures are responsible for the current surge.

The pandemic is far from over

COVID-19 comes in waves and we cannot predict when the next surge will be. This is evident from countries and regions across the globe. As COVID-19 fatigue makes it difficult for citizens to adhere to COVID-19 appropriate behaviors, it is critical to ensure precautions are taken in high-risk settings. Schools, colleges, places of worship, offices, restaurants, any social gatherings, shops and markets should ensure all SOPs are in place to avoid any super spreader event.

People with COVID-19 like symptoms should immediately avoid being in such settings, isolate and get tested as necessary. This, along with vaccines, is our ticket out of this pandemic.

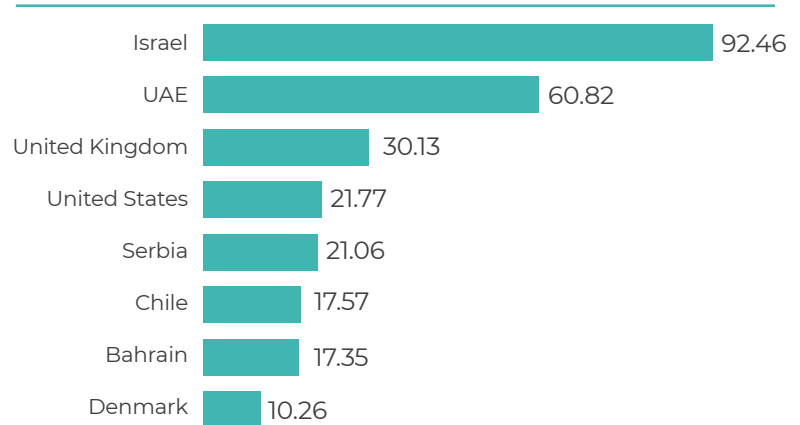

At the backdrop of the emergence of highly transmissible variants, the COVAX project led by WHO, GAVI, CEPI, UNICEF and other partners are working to ensure all countries start vaccinating their citizens. The COVAX project has started supplying the COVISHIELD vaccine from the Serum Institute of India to Africa, and other Covax countries are in line to receive the same.

In such an interconnected world, it is critical that all countries are protected equally. In similar lines, *all stakeholders in the state should ensure citizens from all districts are protected equally for everyone to be safe.*

Covid-19 vaccination dose administered per 100 people (Feb 27, 2021)



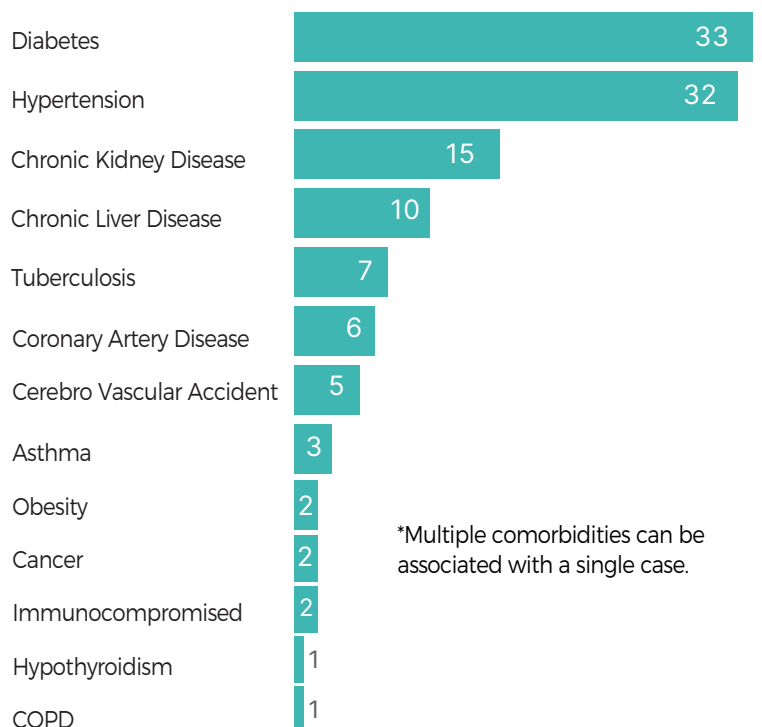

THE URGENT NEED FOR VACCINATING HIGH RISK GROUPS - SENIOR CITIZENS AND THOSE WITH COMORBIDITIES

Senior citizens 60 years and above and those with comorbidities between 45-59 years of age have been prioritized as they are at the highest risk of infection, severe disease, or death. 84 % of Covid—19 deaths in the state have associated comorbidities.

The state data on COVID-19 deaths indicate Hypertension, Diabetes, Chronic Kidney/ liver diseases are the most common associated diseases with COVID-19 deaths. The high risk needs to be protected as early as possible. ***The earlier the vaccine, the safer is the individual.***

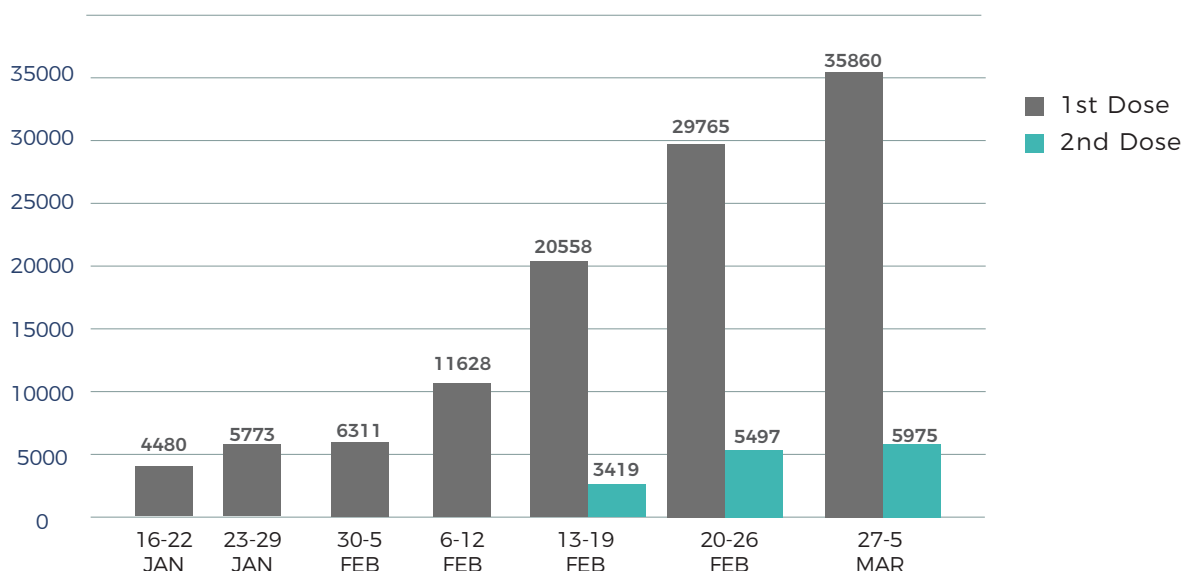

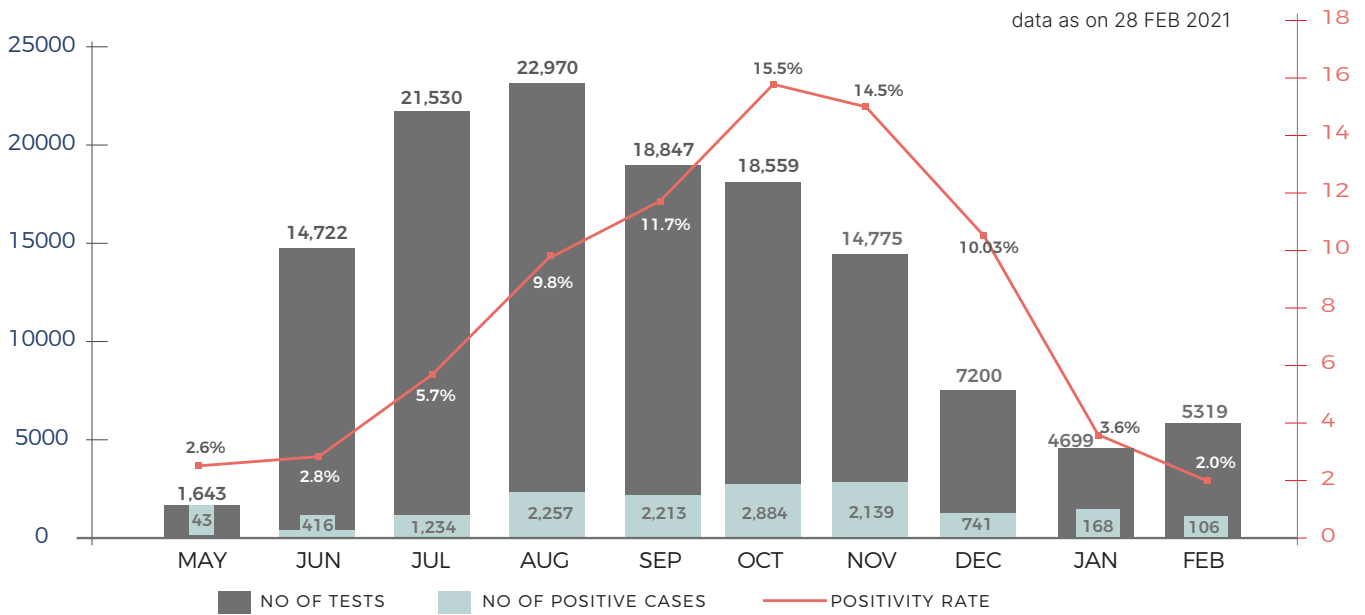

MONTHLY TESTING & POSITIVITY RATE

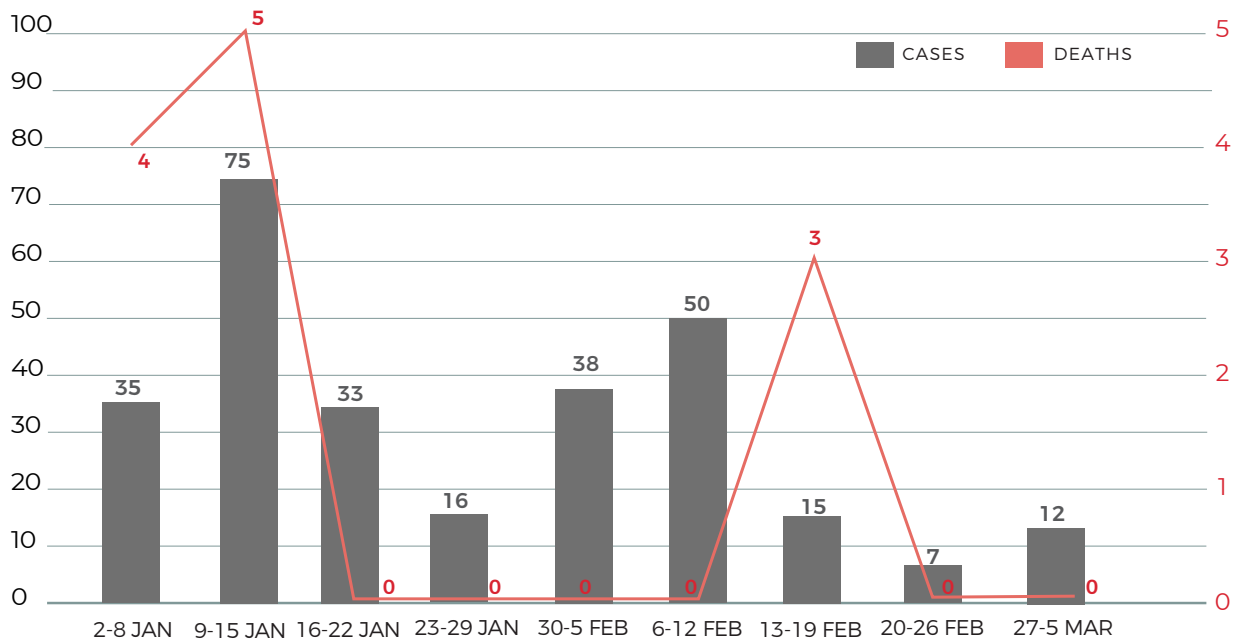

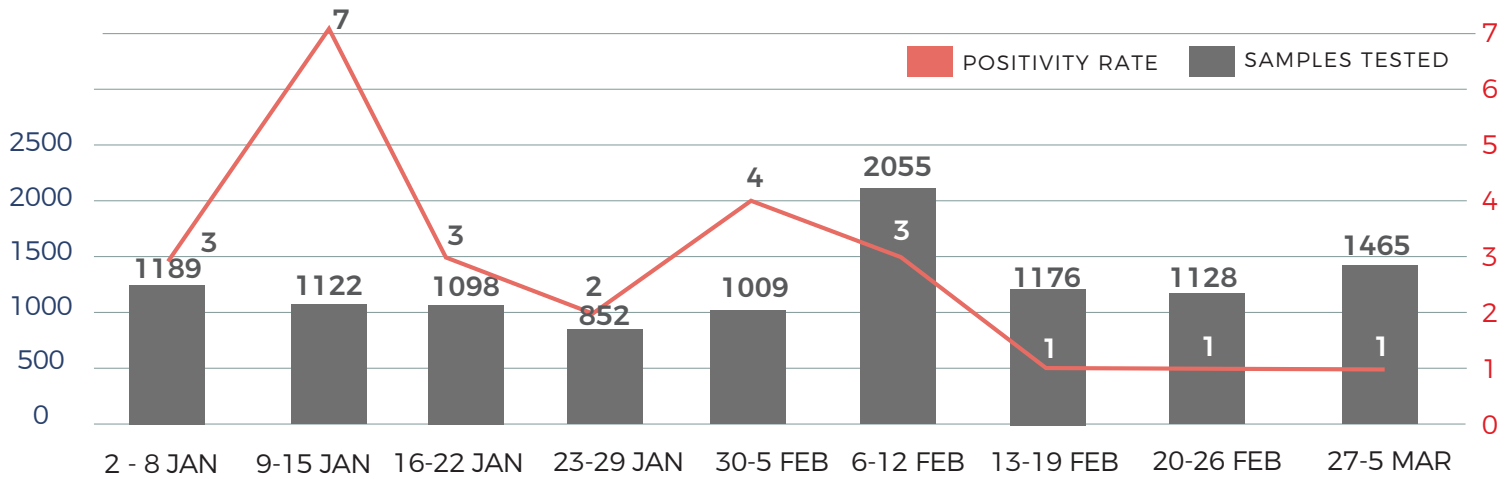

All COVID-19 deaths are certified by the state death committee as per ICMR and WHO ICD 10 guideline.

- Total Deaths: 81
- Median Age: 55 yrs
- Range: 24 - 90 yrs
- Gender: Males 73%
- Deaths with comorbidities: 84%
- Most common comorbidities: Hypertension & diabetes

58% deaths are below 60 years.

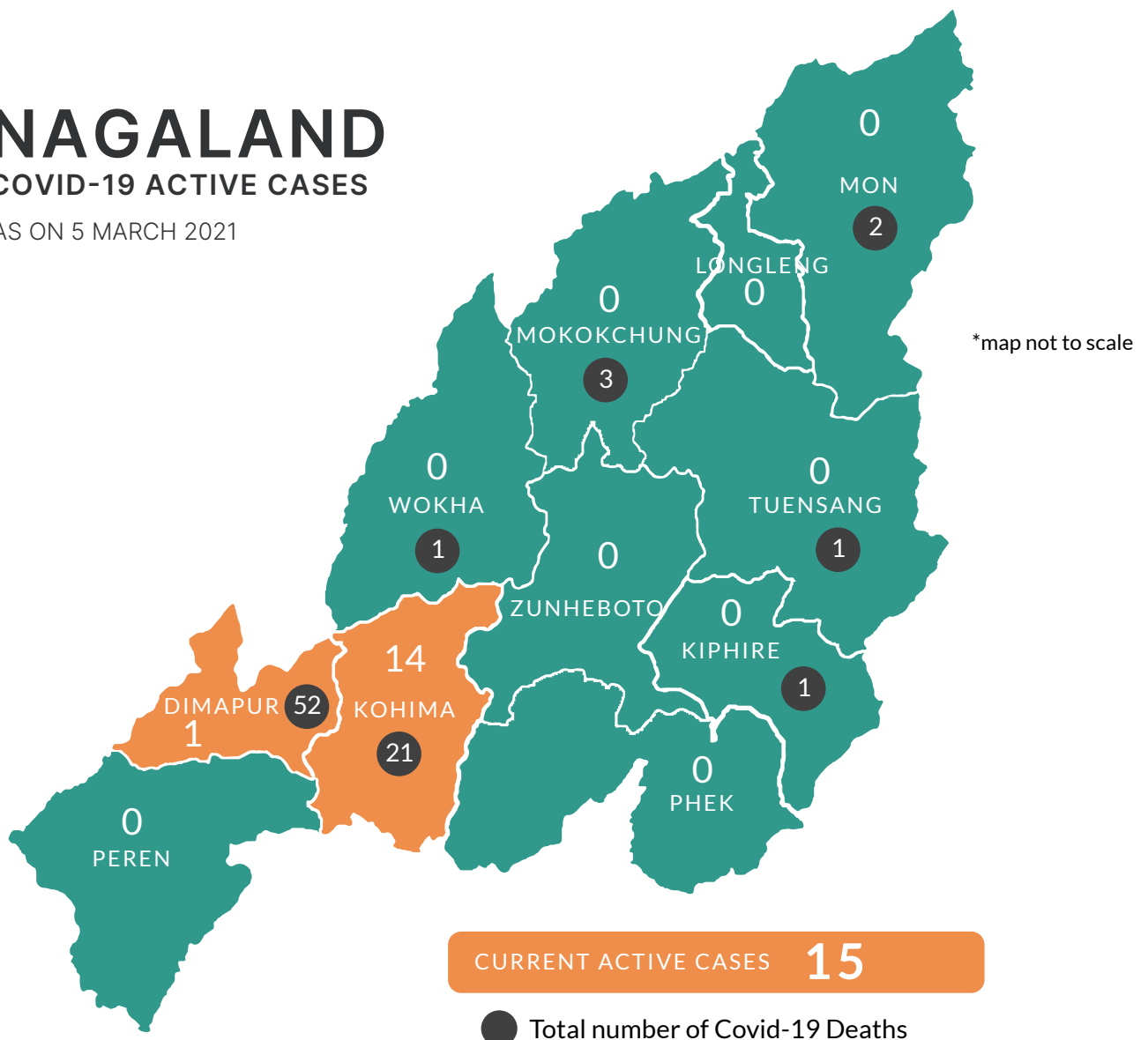
Most common affected age group is 40-49 and 30-39-year age groups.

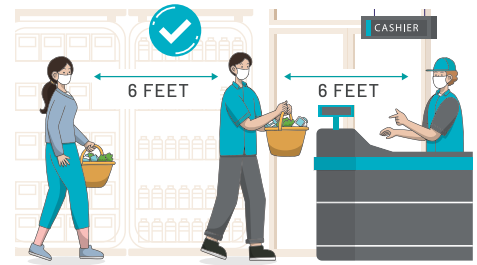
