The latest news as of 6pm on Monday 20 April

77 new deaths and 401 new cases confirmed

- the HPSC has been notified that 77 people diagnosed with COVID-19 in Ireland have died, bringing the total to 687 deaths
- 401 additional cases have been confirmed in Ireland
- there are now 15,652 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Ireland

Location of deaths

East of Ireland	67
West of Ireland	4
North West of Ireland	4
South of Ireland	2

Breakdown of the 77 deaths

• 42 females and 34 males (1 case has not been fully reported)

- the median age of the people who died was 84
- 54 people had underlying health conditions

There have now been 687 COVID-19 related deaths in Ireland.

Breakdown of the 687 total COVID-19 related deaths in Ireland

- 348 (51%) deaths occurred in hospitals
- the median age was 83
- the mean age was 69
- the age range was 23-105
