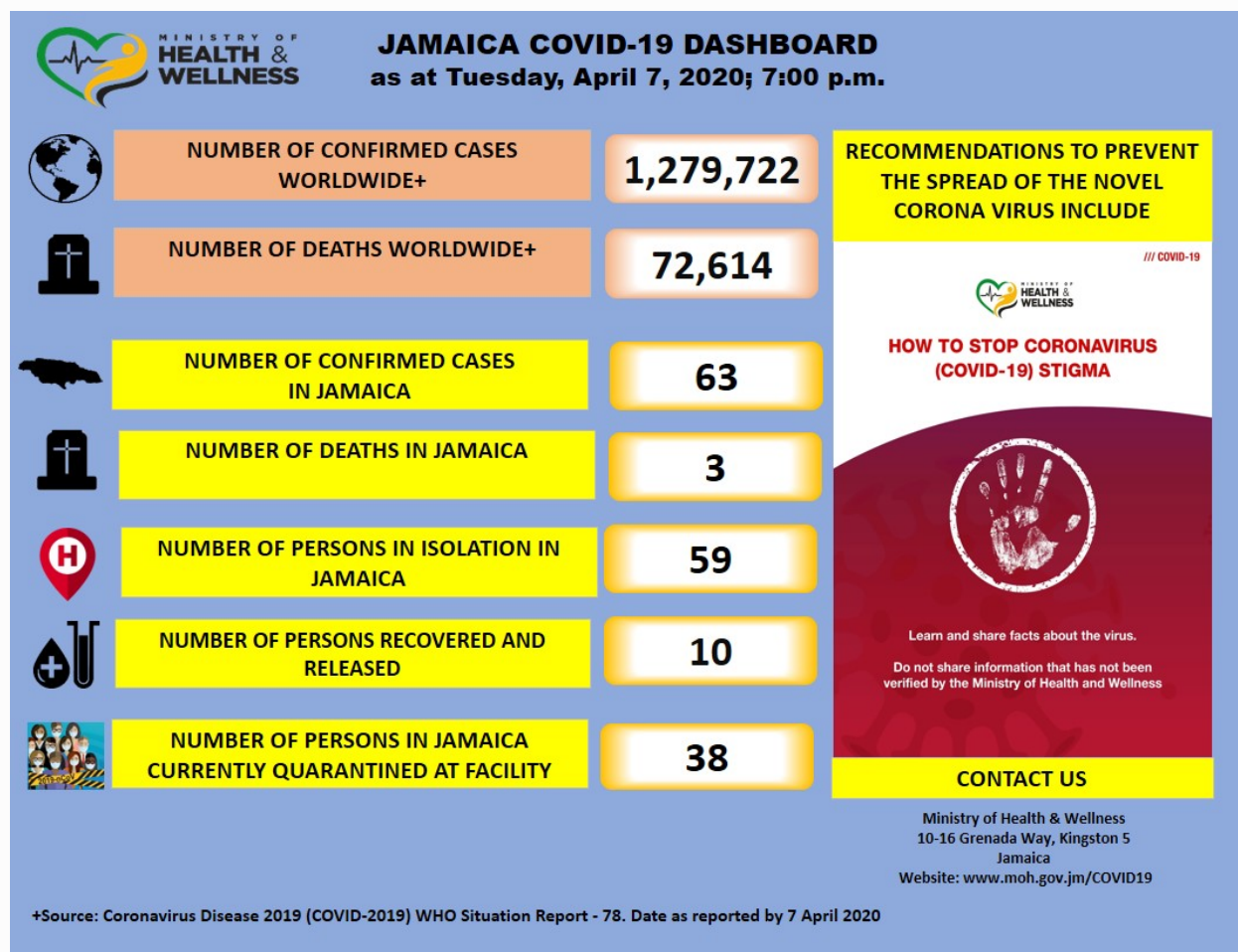

Wash your hands as often as possible

1. Eat
2. Touch your eyes, nose or mouth
3. After using the restroom
4. Sneeze, cough, blow or wipe your nose
5. Touch animals or pets



What are the steps of handwashing?

- Wet hands with water.
- Apply enough soap to cover all areas of your hands.
- For 20 seconds, scrub the middle and back of both hands, wrists, between fingers and under fingernails.
- Rinse hands properly.
- Dry hands with a paper towel.

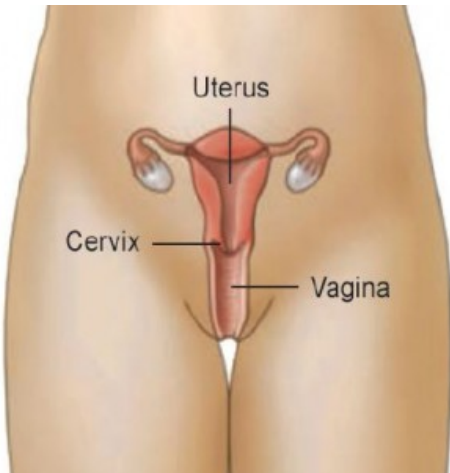
