COVID-19 (novel coronavirus)

There are currently outbreaks overseas of a new disease called COVID-19. This section provides the latest updates, information and advice on COVID-19.

Current situation

New Zealand has five confirmed cases of COVID-19. See our latest media release for a summary of the current status.

With continued vigilance the chance of widespread community outbreak is expected to remain low.

People coming into New Zealand should check our <u>information for travellers arriving to New Zealand</u> as they may be subject to border controls or asked to self-isolate.

We're also asking people who have visited <u>countries or areas of concern</u> and who have developed symptoms of fever, cough or shortness of breath to seek medical advice – phone Healthline's dedicated COVID-19 number <u>0800 358 5453</u> or contact your GP, including phoning ahead of your visit.
