Current situation

New Zealand has **1,440** confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. More information is available on our <u>current cases page</u>. With continued vigilance the chance of widespread community outbreak is expected to remain low.

New Zealand is currently at Alert Level 4 – Eliminate. This means that it is likely that the disease is not contained. See more information about Alert levels 🗗.

The Prime Minister has announced further details about what a move to Alert Level 3 would mean for New Zealanders. This information is available at <u>covid19.govt.nz</u>.
