Current situation

New Zealand has 1,445 confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. More information is available on our <u>current cases page</u>. With continued vigilance the chance of widespread community outbreak is expected to remain low.

New Zealand is currently at **Alert Level 4 – Eliminate**. At 11.59 pm on Monday 27 April New Zealand will move back to **Alert Level 3 - Restrict**. Information about health and disability services at Alert Level 3 is being finalised and will be made available on this website.
