Current situation

New Zealand has **1,451** confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19. More information is available on our <u>current cases page</u>. With continued vigilance the chance of widespread community outbreak is expected to remain low.

New Zealand is currently at Alert Level 4 – Eliminate. At 11.59 pm on Monday 27 April New Zealand will move back to Alert Level 3 - Restrict. To find out more see:
