Current situation

New Zealand is currently at Alert Level 1. To find out more see Health and disability services at Alert Level 1.

There are 21 active cases of COVID-19 in New Zealand. New Zealand's confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19 to date is 1556 – see our current cases page.

The focus is now on protecting New Zealanders with:

- <u>robust border controls</u>
- <u>continued surveillance and testing</u>
- contact tracing capability and rapid isolation of new cases
- public support to prevent any further spread, like good hygiene and keeping records of movement.
