



## CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) HIGHLIGHTS

- On the 11th of April 2020, **13 new** confirmed cases of COVID-19 were recorded in Nigeria
- Till date, 318 cases have been confirmed, 70 cases have been discharged and ten deaths have been recorded in Nigeria
- The 13 new cases are reported from three states- Lagos (11), Delta (1), Kano (1).

- A multi-sectoral national emergency operations centre (EOC), activated at Level 3, continues to coordinate the national response activities
