Reported Daily by Facilities Status: Occupied | Available





Ana Hospital, soon to be a Level 3 Hospital The Department of Health (DOH), with Manila Mayor Francisco "Isko Moreno" Domagoso, and Vice Mayor Honey Lacuna, recently inspected Sta. Ana Hospital to check the situation of its healthcare workers and facility. In his Labor Day message to the hospital officials and staff, Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III said that Sta. Ana Hospital has what it takes to be a Level 3 hospital soon. Level 3 hospitals are facilities equipped with isolation rooms at the emergency and in-patient departments and are capable of managing infectious cases.
May 01, 2020	5:00 PM	DOH issues Press Release: DOH, other agencies work to prevent COVID-19 in closed-setting facilities The Department of Health, together with the Department of Justice, World Health Organization, and International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) conducted an initial assessment, investigation, and management of cases at the Correctional Institution for Women-Bureau of Corrections and New Bilibid Prison. This is the start of the ongoing coordination with the Bureau of Corrections (BuCor) and Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP) to conduct targeted testing, provide treatment and management of cases, and ensure that infection control measures are in place to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in penal and correctional facilities. Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III assured that the DOH is also closely working with the ICRC in building isolation facilities for probable and suspect cases inside the New Bilibid Prison.

Duque III commended Makati City's efforts to keep the COVID-19 infection rate low amongst its healthcare workers during his visit in the Ospital ng Makati (OsMak) and the quarantine facility in Pembo Elementary School, today. Dr. Vergel Binay, OsMak's OIC Medical Director reported to the Health Chief that only 18 out of its almost 1,300 healthcare workers have tested positive, or an infection rate of only 1.4 percent...
