

Reported Daily by Facilities Status: Occupied | Available





May 05, 2020	5:00 PM	DOH issues Press Release: New mega swabbing center to ramp up COVID-19 testing The Department of Health (DOH) today, together with National Action Plan Against COVID-19 Chief Implementer Secretary Carlito Galvez, Jr. and Deputy Chief Implementer Secretary Vivencio Dizon, inspected the Palacio de Maynila Tent swabbing center, one of the four mega swabbing centers expected to test an estimated 20,000 returning Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) starting tomorrow. Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III checked on whether the facility observes DOH-issued protocols on testing and proper distancing by going through a short simulation of the crowd and patient management in the facility

In Tuesday's Beat COVID-19 Virtual Presser, the DOH also noted that the case doubling time, or the time it takes for newly reported cases to increase two-fold, has slowed significantly since the beginning of the outbreak one of the signs that the COVID-19 curve is starting to flatten

Health Undersecretary Dr. Maria Rosario Singh-Vergeire, reported that the country is starting to experience a flattening of the COVID-19 curve. However, she warned of a resurgence of cases when the ECQ is lifted and people start being complacent about social distancing.
