





# <sup>5:00</sup> DOH issues Press Release: Beyond numbers: What the flattening curve really means; protecting <sup>PM</sup> children in the time of COVID-19

The Philippines is beginning to flatten the curve. This was reiterated in the May 6 Beat COVID-19 Virtual Presser with Health Undersecretary Dr. Maria Rosario Singh-Vergeire and Dr. John Wong, an epidemiologist with the Inter-Agency Task Force's (IATF) sub-technical working group on data analytics.
