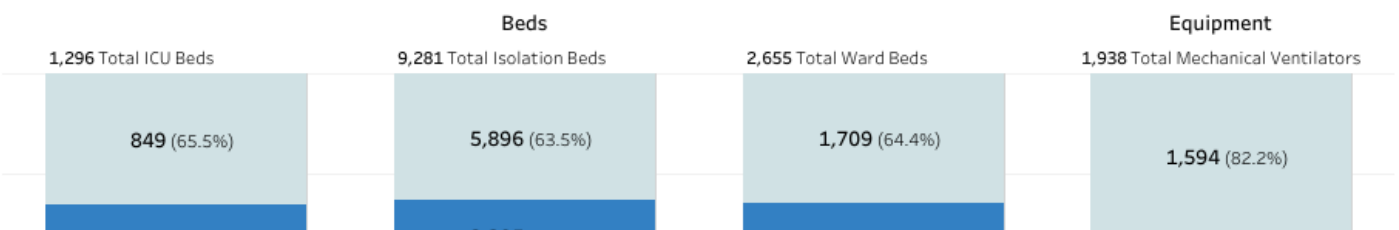

Status: Occupied | Available

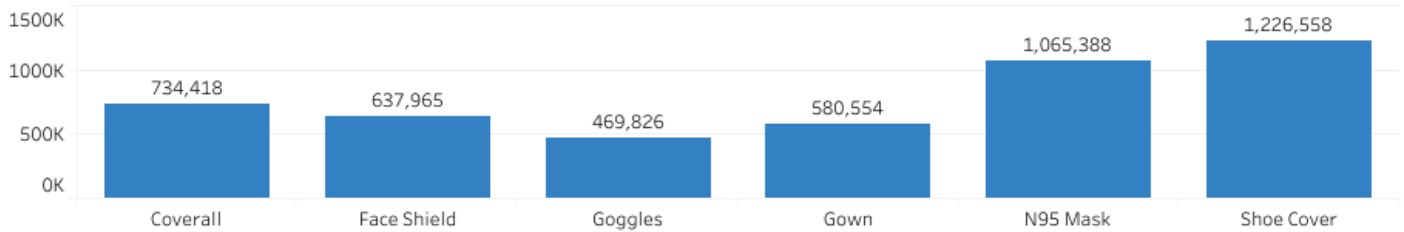
