#### NOTICE

Under new guidelines issued by the Public Health
Authority, no COVID-19 screening tests is needed for
persons placed under home quarantine during or
upon completion of the quarantine period. Testing
may be recommended for persons who develop
symptoms of the infection. All persons placed under
home quarantine who develop symptoms are
advised to visit the special stations at Glacis Health
Centre, Baie Lazare Health Centre and Mont Fleuri
Health Centre. The home quarantine period should
be completed for 14 days, from arrival in Seychelles or
last contact with a positive case of COVID-19. A
certificate of quarantine will be presented at the end
of the quarantine period.

Anyone with symptoms related to COVID-19 are asked to report to special stations at Glacis Health Centre, Baie Lazare Health Centre and Mont Fleuri Health Centre between 8am-12pm and 1pm-2pm. People who use these health centres for regular consultations, should go to their regional centres.
