As of 31 March 2020, 12pm, the Ministry of Health (MOH) has confirmed 16 imported and 31 local cases of COVID-19 infection in Singapore.

- 16 imported cases had travel history to Australia, Europe, ASEAN, and other parts of Asia.
- 13 cases are linked to clusters or previous cases.
- 18 cases are currently unlinked, and contact tracing is ongoing.

12 more cases of COVID-19 infection have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities. Of the 423 confirmed cases who are still in hospital, most are stable or improving. 22 are in critical condition in the intensive care unit.

260 cases who are clinically well but still test positive for COVID-19 are isolated and cared for at Concord International Hospital, Mount Elizabeth Hospital, Gleneagles Hospital and the Community Isolation Facility at D'Resort NTUC.
