As of 10 April 2020, 12pm, the Ministry of Health (MOH) has confirmed an additional 198 cases of COVID-19 infection in Singapore.

Among the cases:

- 0 imported
- 98 are linked to known clusters
- 29 are linked to other cases
- 71 are pending contact tracing

Among the linked cases:

- 79 cases were linked to clusters at foreign worker dormitories
- 48 were linked to non-dormitory clusters

32 more cases of COVID-19 infection have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities. Of the 875 confirmed cases who are still in hospital, most are stable or improving. 32 are in critical condition in the intensive care unit

734 cases who are clinically well but still test positive for COVID-19 are isolated and cared for at community facilities.

Another death due to COVID-19

An 86 year-old female Singapore Citizen, has passed away from complications due to COVID-19 infection on 9 April 2020 night. She was admitted to NCID on 1 April, and was confirmed to have COVID-19 infection on the same day. NCID has reached out to her family and is extending assistance to them.

To date, 7 have passed away from complications due to COVID-19 infection.
