As of 10 May 2020, 12pm, the Ministry of Health (MOH) has confirmed 876 new cases of COVID-19 infection in Singapore.

## Among the cases:

- 1 imported case who had been placed on Stay-Home Notice upon arrival in Singapore
- 4 are cases in the community
  - o 2 Singaporeans/Permanent Residents, 2 Work Passes
- 11 are Work Permit holders residing outside dormitories
- 860 are Work Permit holders residing in dormitories

Of the new cases, 98% are linked to known clusters, while the rest are pending contact tracing.

425 more cases of COVID-19 infection have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities. To date, 2,721 have fully recovered from the infection and have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities.

Most of the 1,097 confirmed cases who are still in hospital are stable or improving. 22 are in critical condition in the intensive care unit.

19,498 cases who have mild symptoms, or are clinically well but still test positive for COVID-19 are isolated and cared for at community facilities.

20 have passed away from complications due to COVID-19 infection.


