

COVID-19: Cases in Singapore

An update of the latest confirmed cases in Singapore

As of 12 June 2020, 12pm, the Ministry of Health (MOH) has confirmed 463 new cases of COVID-19 infection in Singapore.

Among the cases:

- Imported cases: **0**
- Cases in the community: **18**
 - 8 Singaporeans/Permanent Residents, 2 Work Pass holders, 8 Work Permit holders
- Cases residing in dormitories: **445**

Of new cases, 98% are linked to known clusters, the rest are pending contact tracing.

754 more cases of COVID-19 infection have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities. To date, 28,040 have fully recovered from the infection and have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities.

Most of the 239 confirmed cases who are still in hospital are stable or improving. 2 are in critical condition in the intensive care unit.

11,546 cases who have mild symptoms, or are clinically well but still test positive for COVID-19 are isolated and cared for at community facilities.

25 have passed away from complications due to COVID-19 infection.
