COVID-19: Cases in Singapore

An update of the latest confirmed cases in Singapore

As of 30 June 2020, 12pm, the Ministry of Health (MOH) has confirmed 246 new cases of COVID-19 infection in Singapore.

Among the cases:

- Imported cases: 1
 - 1 Permanent Resident
- Cases in the community: 5
 - 2 Singaporeans, 3 Work Permit holders
- Cases residing in dormitories: 240

Of new cases, 98% are linked to known clusters, the rest are pending contact tracing.

515 more cases of COVID-19 infection have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities. To date, 38,500 have fully recovered from the infection and have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities.

Most of the 215 confirmed cases who are still in hospital are stable or improving. 1 is in critical condition in the intensive care unit.

5,166 cases who have mild symptoms, or are clinically well but still test positive for COVID-19 are isolated and cared for at community facilities.

26 have passed away from complications due to COVID-19 infection.
