



## **COVID-19: Cases in Singapore**

An update of the latest confirmed cases in Singapore

As of 16 August 2020, 12pm, the Ministry of Health (MOH) has confirmed 86 new cases of COVID-19 infection in Singapore.

## Among the cases:

- Imported cases: 6
  - 1 Singaporean, 1 Work Pass holder, 3 Dependant's Pass holders, 1 Student's Pass holder

Amongst the 6 imported cases, 1 is a Singaporean who returned to Singapore from Indonesia on 4 August. Another 3 cases are Dependant's Pass holders who arrived from India on 31 July and the Philippines on 4 August. Another case, who is a Work Pass holder currently employed in Singapore, arrived from the Philippines on 4 August. The remaining case is a Student's Pass holder who arrived from Russia on 4 August.

All of them had been placed on 14-day Stay-Home Notice (SHN) upon arrival in Singapore, and were serving their SHN at dedicated facilities. They had been tested while serving their SHN.

- Cases in the community: 2
  - 1 Singaporean, 1 Work Permit holder

Both cases in the community had been identified as contacts of previously confirmed cases. They had been placed on quarantine earlier, and were tested during quarantine to determine their status.

Overall, the number of new cases in the community has remained stable at an average of 2 cases per day in the past 2 weeks. The number of unlinked cases in the community has also remained stable at an average of 1 case per day in the past 2 weeks.

Cases residing in dormitories: 78

The Inter-agency Taskforce has completed the testing of all workers in the dormitories. There are currently about 19,900 workers who are still serving out their quarantine period. These workers will be tested when their quarantine ends, and we expect the case counts to remain high in the coming days, before tapering down thereafter.

Of the new cases, 98% are linked to known clusters, while the rest are pending contact tracing.

432 more cases of COVID-19 infection have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities. In all, 51,953 have fully recovered from the infection and have been discharged from hospitals or community care facilities.

Most of the 82 confirmed cases who are still in hospital are stable or improving. None is in the intensive care unit.

3,685 cases who have mild symptoms, or are clinically well but still test positive for COVID-19 are isolated and cared for at community facilities.

27 have passed away from complications due to COVID-19 infection.
