

COVID-19: Cases in Singapore

An update of the latest confirmed cases in Singapore

As of 19 October 2020, 12pm, the Ministry of Health (MOH) has confirmed and verified that there are no new cases of locally transmitted COVID-19 infection. There are 4 imported cases, who had all been placed on Stay-Home Notice (SHN) upon arrival. Amongst the new cases today, 3 are asymptomatic, and were detected from proactive screening and surveillance, while 1 was symptomatic.

Among the cases:

- Cases in the community: **0**
 - There are no cases in the community today.
- Cases residing in dormitories: **0**
 - There are no cases residing in dormitories today.
- Imported cases: **4**
 - 1 symptomatic, 3 asymptomatic

Amongst the 4 imported cases, 1 is a Singaporean and another is a Singapore Permanent Resident who returned to Singapore from India. Another case is a Student's Pass holder who also arrived from India. The remaining case is a Special Pass holder who arrived from the Philippines to board a ship docked here. They had all been placed on SHN upon arrival in Singapore and were tested while serving SHN.

Overall, the number of new cases in the community has remained stable at 4 cases a week in the past 2 weeks. The number of unlinked cases in the community has increased from none in the week before, to 2 cases in the past week.

12 more cases of COVID-19 infection have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities. In all, 57,819 have fully recovered from the infection and have been discharged from hospitals or community care facilities.

Most of the 34 confirmed cases who are still in hospital are stable or improving. None is in the intensive care unit.

34 cases who have mild symptoms, or are clinically well but still test positive for COVID-19 are isolated and cared for at community facilities.

28 have passed away from complications due to COVID-19 infection.
