

## COVID-19: Cases in Singapore

An update of the latest confirmed cases in Singapore

As of 13 December 2020, 12pm, the Ministry of Health (MOH) has confirmed and verified that there are no new cases of locally transmitted COVID-19 infection. There are 7 imported cases, who had already been placed on Stay-Home Notice (SHN) upon arrival in Singapore. All new cases today are asymptomatic, and were detected from proactive screening and surveillance.

Overall, the number of new cases in the community has remained low, with no new cases in the past week.

- Cases in the community: **0**

There are no cases in the community today.

- Cases residing in dormitories: **0**

There are no cases residing in dormitories today.

- Imported cases: **7 (7 asymptomatic)**

Amongst the 7 imported cases, 1 is a Singapore Permanent Resident who returned from India. Another 5 cases are currently employed in Singapore. Of these, 1 is a Work Pass holder who arrived from India and 4 are Work Permit holders who arrived from the Philippines, Indonesia and India. The remaining case is a Dependant's Pass holder who arrived from Indonesia. They had already been placed on SHN upon arrival in Singapore and were tested while serving SHN.

11 more cases of COVID-19 infection have been discharged from hospitals or community isolation facilities. In all, 58,208 have fully recovered from the infection and have been discharged from hospitals or community care facilities.

Most of the 21 confirmed cases who are still in hospital are stable or improving. None is in critical condition in the intensive care unit.

62 cases who have mild symptoms, or are clinically well but still test positive for COVID-19 are isolated and cared for at community facilities.

29 have passed away from complications due to COVID-19 infection.

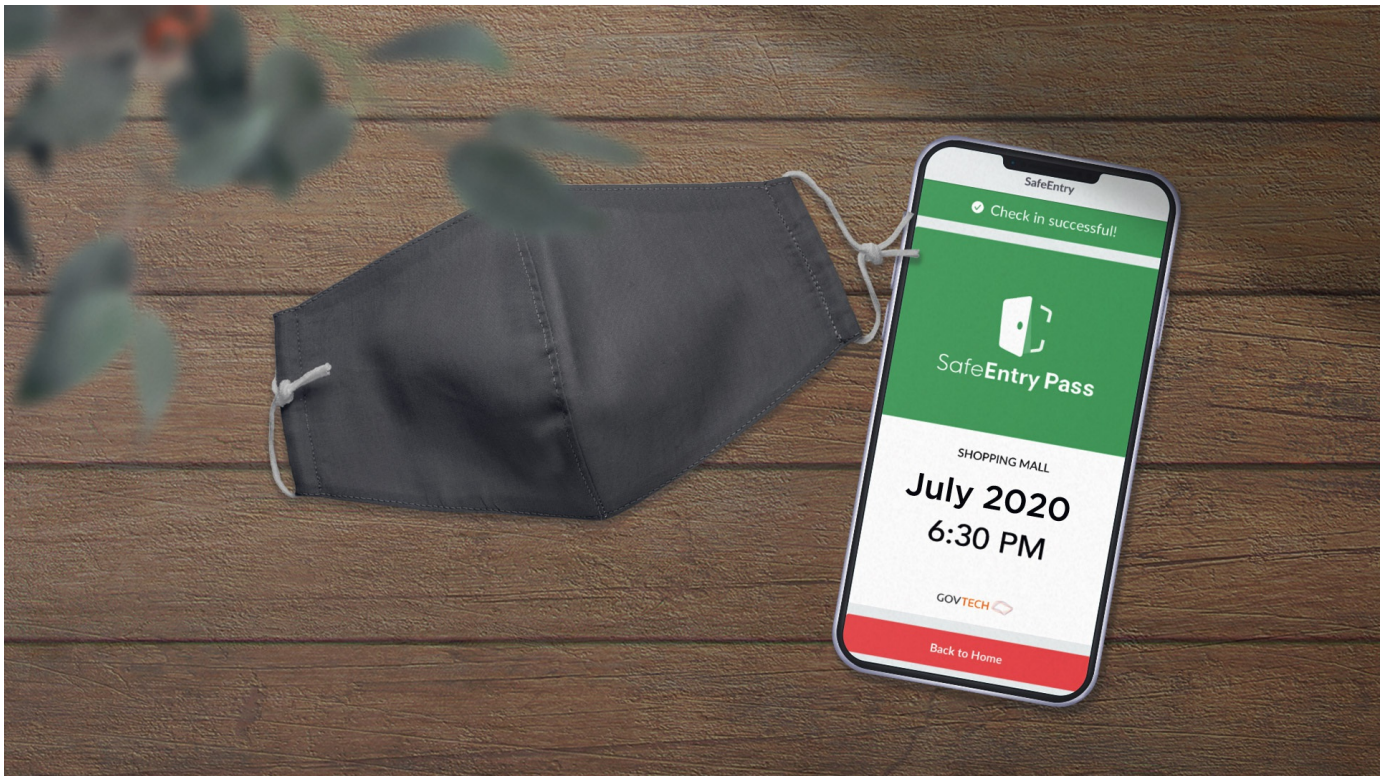

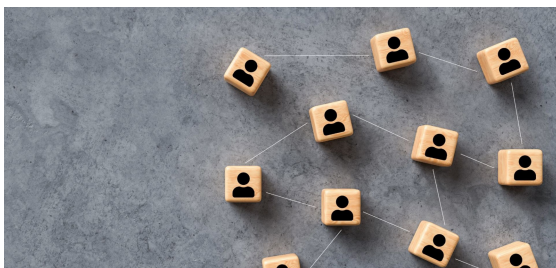
