As of 22 June, almost all of the measures put in place to fight the coronavirus have been lifted. Only the ban on large-scale events for over 1000 people is set to remain in place until the end of August.

Regulations and bans due to the coronavirus

On 28 February, the Federal Council began to introduce measures to protect the public from the coronavirus; these were gradually tightened up until 21 March. In view of the epidemiological situation in Switzerland, it again began to ease these measures from the end of April.
