3. Thailand Implementations

- The Department of Provincial Administration, Ministry of Interior, announced the exemption and reduction of fees related to household registration, issue of important documents about person names, identification card and civil registration work only in 28 provinces which are declared the maximum control area. The exemption and reduction of fees will be valid for 120 days from the date of announcement (8 January 2021).
- Samut Sakhon province announced the relief measures for some businesses as follows:
 1) Barber shops in the entire province can be open from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., 2) Food shops in the entire province can be open except for those in the 8 sub-districts of Muang district that had been announced the maximum control area (Tha Sai, Mahachai, Krokkrak, Tha Chalom, Nadi, Bang Ya Phraek, Khok Kham and Tha Chin). Food shops in these sub-districts can be open from 06:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Prevention and control

measures of COVID-19 must be carried out including the social distancing as well as limitation of the customer numbers. The announcement shall be effective from 16 January to 1 February 2021.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

Monitoring and analysis of the screening during 15 December 2020 to 15 January 2021 had shown that all provinces reported the COVID-19 screening efforts both actively (screening in communities) and passively (screening in hospitals). There were both Thais and foreigners who received the screening services. It was also found that in areas where there were high number of screened people, the opportunity to detect infected persons was also high. Therefore, there might be a need to set a target number of screened people in some areas for risk analysis. The results of risk analysis, thus, can be brought into consideration for the application of the relief measures in the areas. In addition, everyone should apply the **D-M-H-T Measures** to strictly prevent COVID-19 pandemic, i.e., **D: Distancing space** between each other **M: Mask wearing H: Hand washing T: Testing body temperature** before entering places and events. Moreover, if someone develops fever, cough, sore throat or loss of smell and taste, an urgent visit to the hospital is advised. The patient should inform the doctor about the travel history as much as possible.
