3. Thailand Imprementations

 Chon Buri Province had announced the extension of visitors banned in and out of Koh Si Chang district from January 20, 2021 onwards until the situation of COVID-19 is resolved. Provincial measures will be established for all types of boat operators and district-chief officers of Koh Si Chang for screening visitors traveling in - out in the area.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

From the COVID-19 situation monitoring on January 21, 2021, Thailand had a total of 12,795 cumulative confirmed cases with 8,558 cases from the new outbreak and the number of cases confirmed on January 21 is 142 which is higher than that reported on January 20. Still, the area with the highest number of new confirmed cases is Samut Sakhon with 63

cases from surveillance and service systems and 29 cases from proactive searching, and 70 cases are migrant workers. Therefore, the government are requesting the cooperation from the areas that still have the confirmed cases and migrant workers to follow that DMH measures which are social **D**istancing, **M**asking wearing, and **H**and washing, as well as setting up the quarantine area within the factories, monitoring the situation, consider the proactive screening especially on those suspected to be infected, and limited mobility among foreign workers to reduce the chance of spreading the disease.
