3. Thailand Implementations

- The Center for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA), the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Public Health tasked all provinces to expedite the process of providing COVID-19 vaccines to the front line workers to the target of 600,000 doses or 300,000 persons within this week.
- Bangkok Metropolitan Administration has collaborated with relevant agencies to prepare healthcare workers to treat COVID-19 cases. This collaboration includes healthcare workers from 11 hospitals under the Medical Service Department, 69 Public Health Centers under the Health Department, Bangkok Metropolitan Administration, hospitals that fall under the authority of the Ministry of Public Health, university hospitals and private hospitals in Bangkok. There are currently around 100 hospitals available to provide COVID-19 vaccination services to people in the Bangkok area, with a target of administering 30,000 shots daily.



4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

The global situation of COVID-19 shows more than 144 million cases have been confirmed. The outbreak is increasing in India and the outbreak remains high in North and South America, and Europe. The daily number of new cases has increased until more than 700,000 cases per day since mid-February 2021. The total number of deaths is more than 3,000,000. The cumulative number of new infections in the new outbreak wave in Thailand is 19,250 cases. The number of daily infections in the country has been stable this week at about 1,500 cases per day. Today, there were 1,470 new cases in 67 provinces; most of the infected cases were found in Bangkok, Chiang Mai, Chonburi, Nonthaburi and Prachuap Khiri Khan. Among the COVID-19 patients who were infected in the period after Songkran, most had a history of exposure to COVID-19 patients in the previous entertainment epidemic group. The infections were found to spread to families, workplaces and schools. In addition, the trend of deaths increased this week. All deaths are those with chronic disease, obesity or the elderly. Concerning the vaccination situation in Thailand, there have been 800,000 doses administered. All people must practice social distancing, follow work from home policies, and reduce unnecessary travel. High-risk people such as those with a history of entering the outbreak sites should get tested as soon as possible and avoid contact with people with chronic diseases and the elderly. All provinces should expedite vaccination rollouts to cover medical personnel and prepare vaccinations for people at risk of serious illness.
