3. Thailand Implementations

The Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Ministry of Public Health said that field hospitals in Bangkok are scheduled to be upgraded to provide medical services to moderate patients. It aims to reduce the number of severe cases and to make beds available to hospitals for treating severe cases. It is also to support in August that the Busarakham Hospital will end its contract with IMPACT Muang Thong Thani. A field hospital can be set up to accommodate moderate patients in four corners of the area of Bangkok, including the Nimibutr Pre-Admission Center or Indoor Stadium.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

On June 24, 2021, 8,400,320 persons, or 15.96% of the total population over the age of 18, received the COVID-19 vaccine in Thailand. Of those, 71.63% received the first COVID-19 vaccine and 28.37% completed the vaccination program. Only six percent have mild adverse events following immunization (AEFI). Since June 7, vaccination against COVID-19 has been accelerated for at-risk populations, seniors and people living with seven chronic diseases, including the general public in epidemic areas. The average number of vaccination services is 233,879 people daily. If the vaccination rate remains at this level, more than 12 million people will be given the first dose of the vaccine next month. In addition, it will take approximately 6 months to reach 100% of the Thai population over 18 years. COVID-19 is at risk of being more serious and spreading across the country right now. It still has to accelerate vaccination to control the situation by monitoring and managing adverse events, especially in severe cases. It goes along with building people's trust in vaccination services.
