3. Thailand Implementations

- The Ministry of Public Health and the National Health Security Office have released the resolution regarding the use of the Antigen Screening Kit (ATK) to find new cases of COVID-19 infection. This is the initial amount of 1.014 million of baht. The aim is to provide test kits for service units for distribution to all people, including foreigners. These individuals can themselves be tested for COVID-19 with the ATK between August and September 2021 by allowing the Rajavithi Hospital network to provide testing kits through the Government Pharmaceutical Organization.
- The National Health Security Office has announced a channel where patients with COVID-19 who have previously participated in the home isolation system have not yet received a response from an officer. It also includes new Covid-19 patients who would like to join the Home Isolation System. They can register on the website "https://crmsup.nhso.go.th" or on the application line "@nhso". If you have registered for the Home Isolation system, you will receive:
 - 1. Receive the VDO call service to assess the symptoms 2 times a day.
 - 2. Receive three meals of food.
 - 3. Receive the digital thermometer and Fingertip Pulse Oximeter
 - 4. Receive herbal medicine "Fah Talai Jone " and other commonly used medicines.

5. A referral service for serious symptoms, including the provision of a favipiravir to relieve symptoms.

 Bangkok Metropolis presents checkpoints for active COVID-19 cases from July 20 to 31, 2021 as follows:

1. The Government Complex Commemorating His Majesty, Chaengwattana Road, at the parking lot, 1st floor, B Building, by NHSO in collaboration with the Faculty of Medical Technology, Mahidol University. This location provides tests with an Antigen Test Kit or Rapid Antigen Test.

2. The 72nd Anniversary Min Buri Stadium, Soi Khum Klao 1/5, Khum Klao Road with a free of charge.



4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

The number of reported COVID-19 cases by province over the past two weeks (July 7 to 20, 2021) has shown a declining trend in eight provinces, particularly Bangkok since July 10, 2021. It was related to travelling to other provinces and receiving treatment in their home provinces after being infected or coming into contact with a confirmed case. Chonburi, Samut Sakhon and Phra Nakhon Si Ayutthaya provinces showed distinctly an increasing trend of infected people compared to the last two weeks. Contracting confirmed cases, active case findings and outbreaks in the workplace may be justified by the increasing trend. Therefore, strengthening surveillance in patients under investigation and active case finding at epidemic risk sites in the establishments and the markets must be intensive procedures. In the case of large outbreaks, bubble and seal strategies should be required. Communicate with people to maintain COVID-19 preventative measures, wear masks, wash hands frequently, work from home, reduce unnecessary travel, especially for people gathering. COVID-19 vaccines are administered on an individual basis as soon as practicable.
