

## Coronavirus numbers in London

In the week ending 30 July 2020 in London hospitals, **14** people that have tested positive for COVID-19 have died. Additionally, COVID-19 was mentioned on the death certificates of **6** people.

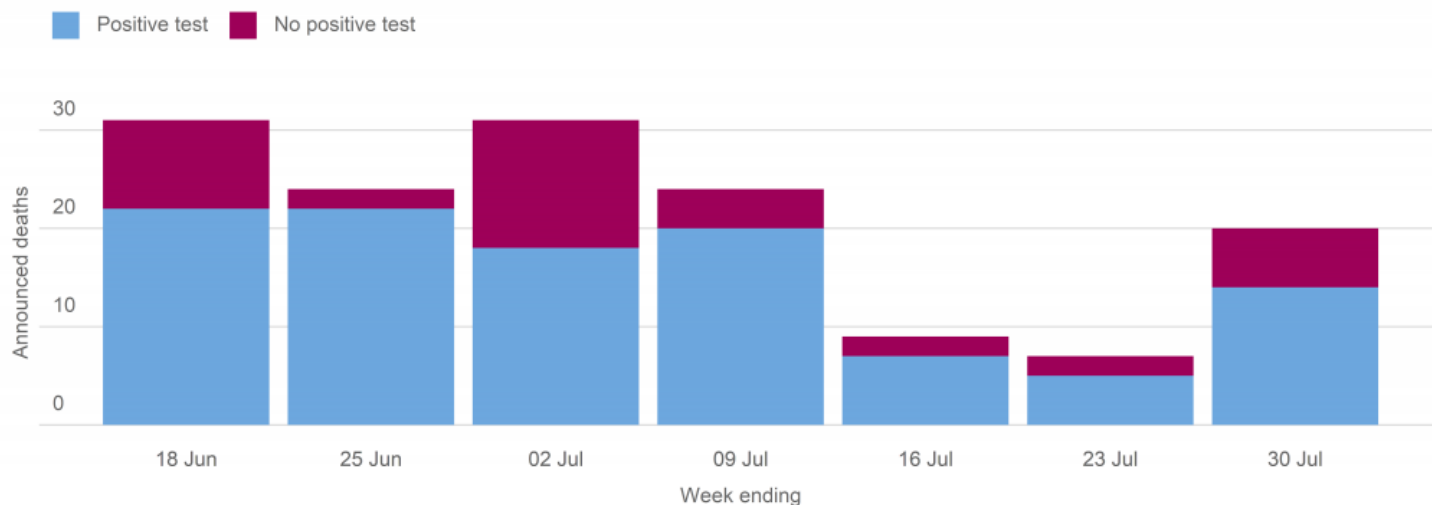
The total number of deaths in London hospitals of patients who had tested positive for COVID-19 is now **6,144**. The total number of deaths in London hospitals where COVID-19 was mentioned on the death certificate is now **222**.

These data are published by NHS England and updated weekly with the deaths from the most recently completed reporting period.

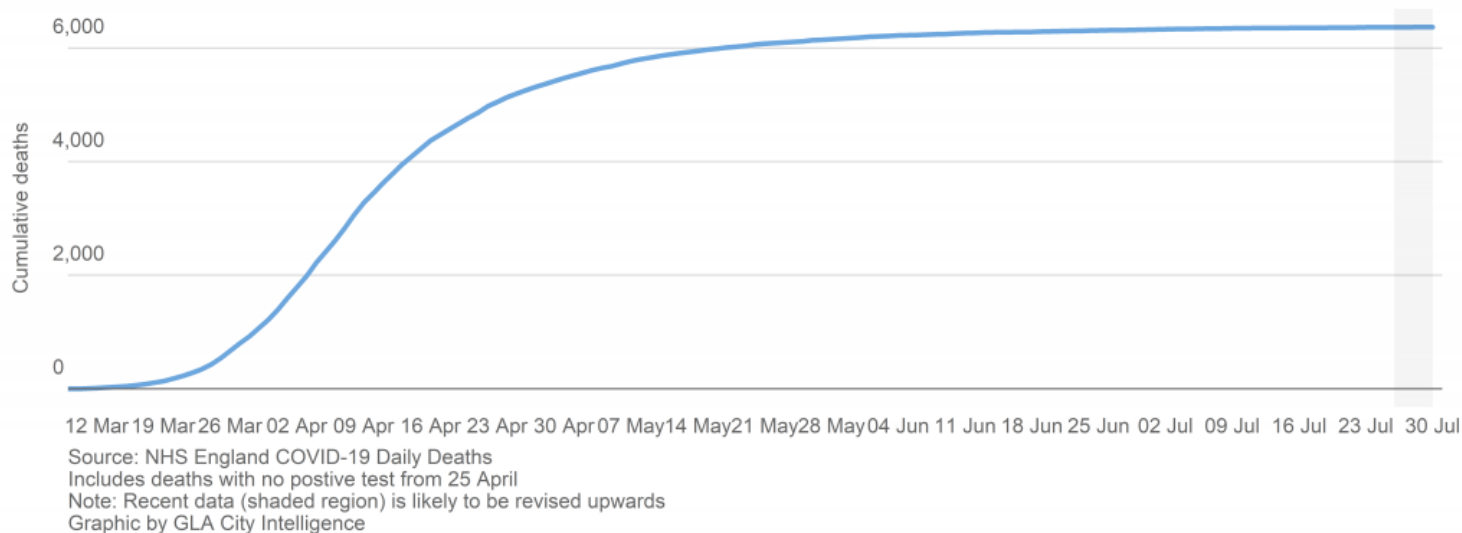

### Occurrences and delays in reporting

Confirmation of COVID-19 diagnosis, death notification and reporting in central figures can take up to several days and the hospitals providing the data are under significant operational pressure. This means that the totals reported at 5pm on each day may not include all deaths that occurred on that day or on recent prior days.

The data published by NHS England includes both date of occurrence and reporting. Deaths by date of occurrence and cumulative deaths are plotted below. Due to the delay in reporting, recent data is expected to be revised upwards in coming days.

### Cumulative COVID-19 deaths in London hospitals by date of occurrence

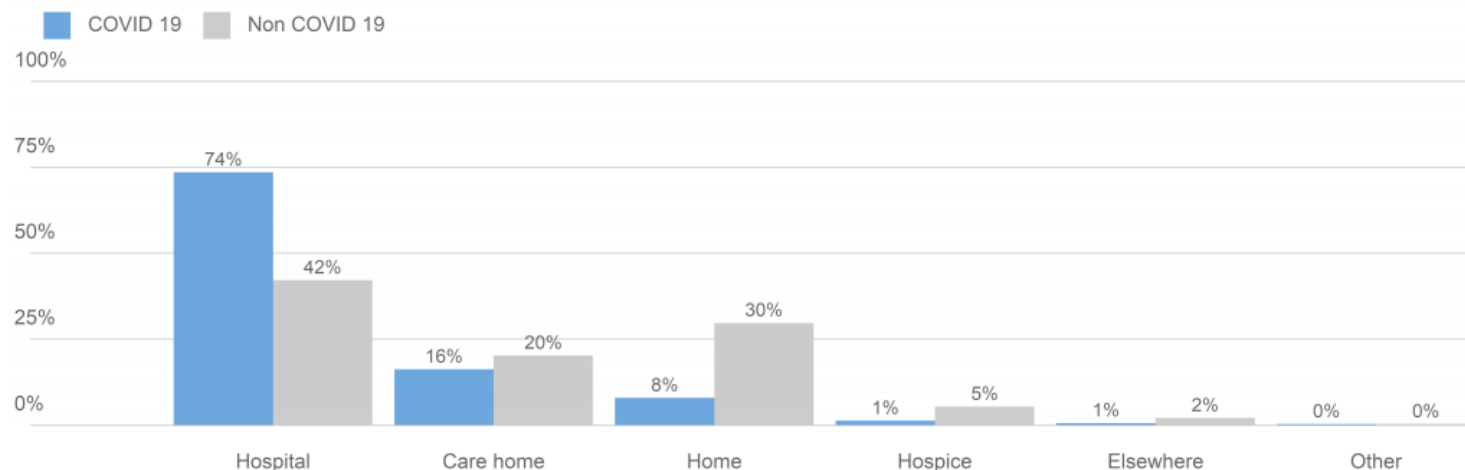

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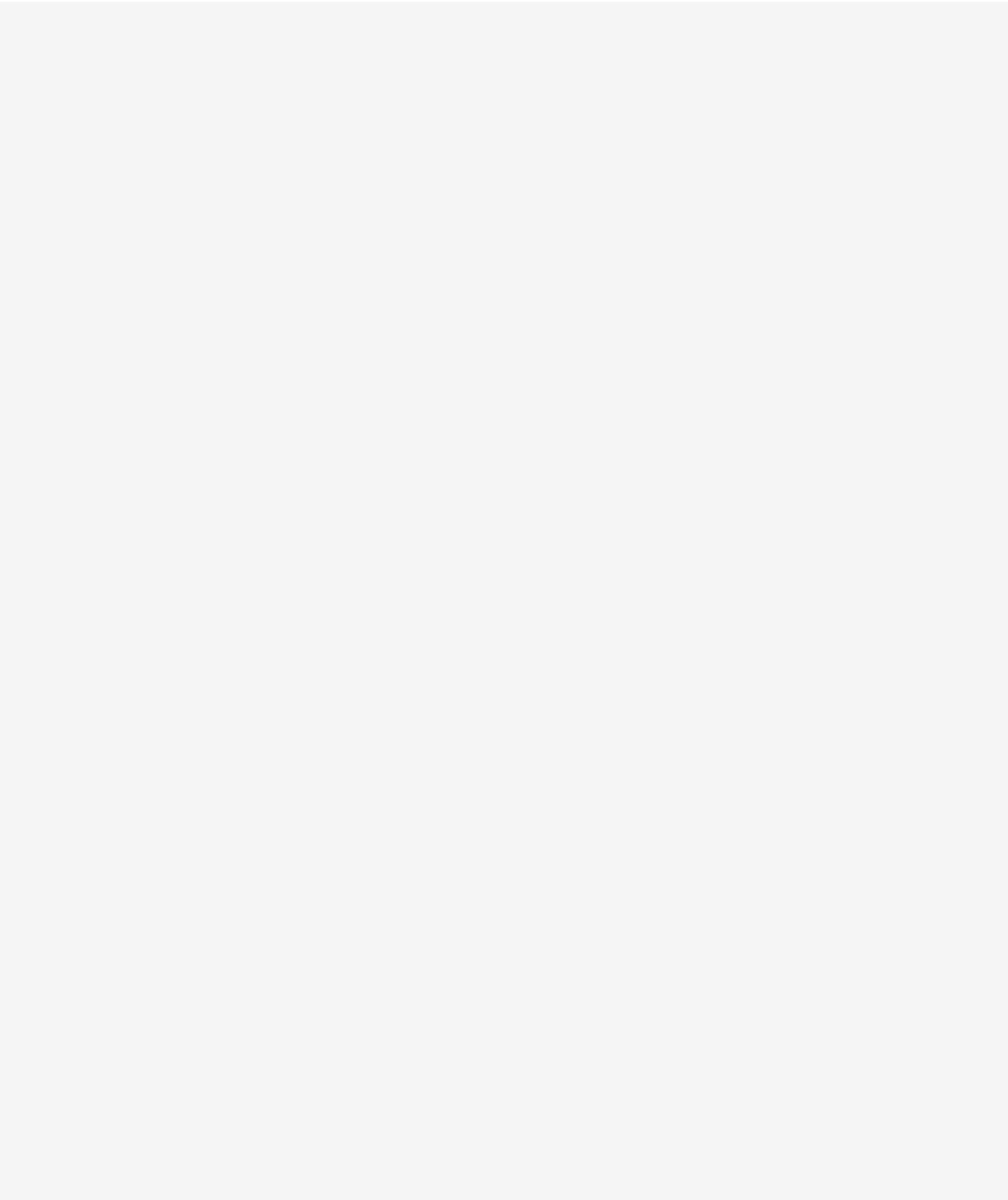
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
