The first case of coronavirus (COVID-19) in Scotland was confirmed in March 2020.

Scottish test numbers: 20 March 2020

A total of 7550 Scottish tests have concluded. Of these:

- 7228 tests were confirmed negative
- 322 tests were positive
- 6 patients who tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) have died
